WHY ARE WE HERE?

- Address military munitions potentially remaining at the former Kanaio Local Training Area (LTA)
 - ► Kanaio LTA was operational until 2003
 - ► HIARNG closed Kanaio LTA in 2016 and the site became eligible for the Military Munitions Response Program (MMRP)
- HIARNG and USACE are investigating Kanaio LTA to determine future actions at this site



PROJECT LOCATION



SITE OVERVIEW


- Approximately 4,771 acres located in Kanaio,
 Maui at the foot of Haleakala
- Bounded by the Pi'ilani Highway to the north, and the Pacific Ocean to the south
- Investigation area located on State of Hawaiiowned land and private landowners
- Potential ecological, biological, archaeological, and cultural resources may be present



SITE OVERVIEW

- Land leased to Ulupalakua Ranch in 1912
- Live fire practices during World War II, into 1950s-60s by the Army and Marine Corps
- HIARNG granted partial access in 1965 for training 6 weeks of the year; increased to 12 weeks in 1966
- HIARNG continued use until lease expired in 2003
- No training was conducted after 2003
- ARNG closed Kanaio LTA in 2016

SITE LAYOUT




PREVIOUS ACTIONS and REPORTS

- 1981 HIARNG Clearance
 - Located and disposed of several unexploded ordnance (UXO) items
- 1996 1998 Surface Ordnance Removal Plan and Removal Action
 - ► Identified ordnance in Impact Areas 1 and 2 and possible ordnance in Impact Area 3A, and small arms in Impact Area 3B
- 2008 Range Assessment Report
 - ► Identified possible Munitions and Explosives of Concern (MEC) and possible Munitions Constituents (MC) remaining at the site

KANAIO LTA OPERATIONAL STATUS

- Closed in 2016 by HIARNG
- Entered Military Munitions Response Program (MMRP)
- MMRP follows the CERCLA process to determine future actions at sites
- 2008 Range Assessment Report served as the Preliminary Assessment
- Currently in Site Inspection phase



SITE INSPECTION PURPOSE

- Assess the nature and extent of Munitions and Explosives of Concern
- Assess the nature and extent of Munitions Constituents in available media
- Collect sufficient data to determine next step(s) at Kanaio LTA
 - No Further Action
 - ► Remedial Investigation/Feasibility Study
 - ▶ Time Critical Removal Action



SITE INSPECTION PROCESS

- Historical Records Report
 - ► Interviews with residents and/or those familiar with range activities
 - ► Review of document archives
- Work Plan
- Field Work
 - ► Geophysical Survey
 - ► Analytical Sampling
- Site Inspection Report



GEOPHYSICAL SURVEY


- Instrument-assisted and visual reconnaissance
- Sweeping 5-foot wide transects
- Transects will cover approximately 48 acres (78 miles)
- GPS data collected and uploaded to GIS daily
- UXO will be marked and local police department will be notified





SURFACE SOIL SAMPLE COLLECTION

- Identify sample locations based on historical data and geophysical survey results
 - ▶ Biased
 - Background
- Collect surface soil samples (0 – 6 inches)
- Analyze samples for:
 - Metals (lead, antimony, copper, zinc)
 - ► Explosives (HMX, RDX, TNT, 2,4-DNT, 2,6-DNT, PETN, WP)





SITE INSPECTION REPORT

- Publish field work findings for MEC and MC
- Incorporate field data with historical data
- Recommend future action(s)
 - ▶ No Further Action
 - ► Remedial Investigation/Feasibility Study
 - ▶ Time Critical Removal Action

- Historical Records Report (Spring 2017)
- Draft Work Plan (Spring 2017)
- Community Meeting 2 (Late Spring 2017)
- Final Work Plan (Summer 2017)
- Field Work (Fall 2017)
- Community Meeting 3 (Spring 2018)
- Site Inspection Report (Summer 2018)
