## CBPO CONNECTION

### REENLISTMENT/EXTENSION

A problem exists where individuals have been reporting to the CBPO more than 3 months prior to their Expiration Term of Service (ETS) to accomplish an Extension/Reenlistment action. In the past individuals were allowed to do so for as early as 6 months, but this option has now been discontinued. A recent change to ANGR 39-09, Enlistment and Reenlistment in the ANG and as a Reserve of the Air Force, states that "members may not be Extended / Reenlisted more than 90 days prior to ETS". Only under special circumstances, such as school or AGR retainability, can this requirement be waived. (DPMQ, 449-5685)

### UNIFORM TIPS (Ref. AFR 35-10)

**EARRINGS:** Women may wear small conservative gold, white pearl, or silver spherical pierced or clip earrings with all uniforms except when safety considerations dictate otherwise. They may also wear small conservative, spherical gold, white pearl, or round diamond pierced or clip earrings with formal, mess dress, ceremonial, and semi-formal uniforms. When worn, earrings will fit tightly against the ear and will not extend below the earlobe. (The band connecting nonpierced earrings may extend slightly below the earlobe.) Only one earring or healing post may be worn on or in each earlobe.

**EYEGASSES AND OTHER ORNAMENTS:** Ornaments on the head, visible ornaments around the neck (ex: gold chains), and ornamentation on eyeglass lenses or frames are prohibited while on duty or in uniform. Conservative eyeglass frames may be worn as needed and when not prohibited by safety regulations.

a. Wear Indoors. Conservative, clear, slightly tinted, or photosensitive lenses, which are practically clear under normal light, may be worn indoors.

b. Wear Outdoors. Conservative sunglasses and photosensitive-type eyeglasses may be worn while outdoors. A "fadish" style sunglass lens, to include mirrored lens, is not appropriate.

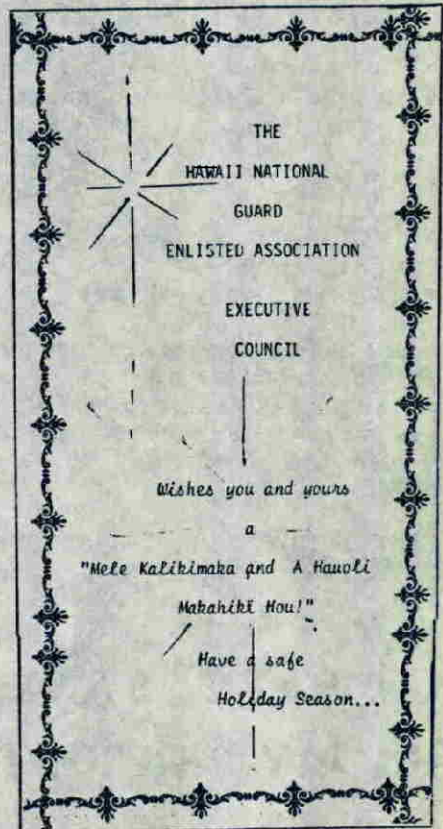
c. Wear in Military Formation. Only conservative, clear, slightly tinted or photosensitive lenses (which are not extremely dark outdoors) may be worn in military formation.

## COMMISSARY EARNINGS STATEMENTS FOR 1988

The commissary earnings statements (CES) for 1988 will be available at your unit by the end of December. Most people will probably get theirs during January UTA. If you have recently performed active duty, these days may not be credited on your initial CES listing. A supplemental CES listing will automatically be generated as these days clear the military pay computer. The maximum number of days of commissary privileges are fourteen. See your unit for instructions to correct any problems. (CBPO, 449-5669)

### FAMILY HANDBOOK

The HNG Family Handbook, which will be distributed on Family Day, is a checklist for you to use when you talk to your spouse, or parents if you are single, about family preparedness. If there is an emergency while you are on military duty, your spouse or parent needs to know where your important papers are located and what to do with them. The Handbook has the items that need your attention and there is ample space to write notes. Be smart, get it done before there is a problem. (CBPO, 449-5669)

## 40 DAYS

The evening of 25 November marks the start of three major holiday periods ending on the morning of 4 January 1988. Air Force statistics showed that in the month of December, 62.5 percent of motor vehicle fatalities can be attributed to Alcohol and/or fatigue. Most of the fatal vehicle mishaps occurred between 2000 and 0400 hours on a Friday or Saturday.

The Holidays are not always "UP" time for everyone. Fatigue, depression and over-indulgence can be especially prevalent during the Holiday season and may have an insidious effect on the safety of operations and maintenance.

As in the past, "Awareness" is the cornerstone for continued safe mission accomplishment.

Be aware of your particular situation and do your part in controlling the risks. This is the only way we can be assured of a safer holiday season. "Have a good one!".

The 154th Civil Engineering Squadron

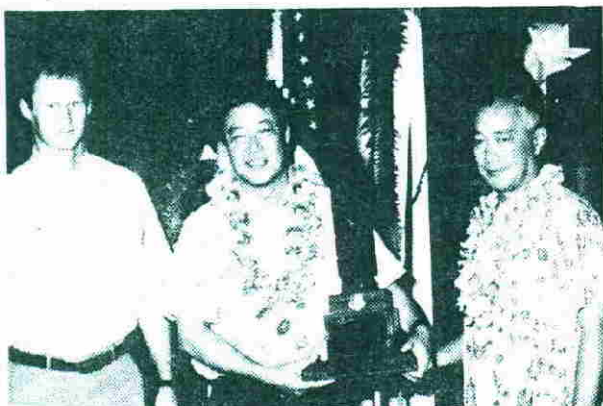
