**PAID-UP COLLEGE OFFERED
WITH 12-YR. ARMY HITCH**

The Army is offering to pay for four years of college for soldiers who sign up for 12 years of service.

The program was started to give the Army a core of highly trained career specialists and non-commissioned officers.

To be eligible, soldiers must be on active duty and must have completed one year of a two year training hitch. They must finish their schooling before they reach 35.

The Army said the academic fields available may include business administration, bacteriology, cinematography, criminology, journalism, political science and many kinds of engineering.

Soldiers will have to sign for three years of service for each year of school.

Applicants must have graduated from an accredited high school or the equivalent. It is estimated that about 300 persons a year will enter the program.

Applications for the 1958 fall college term will be accepted up to May 1.

A regulation on the education program will be published within 30 days.
