With only 300 gallons of fucl remaining, the Squadron's shiny C47, aircraft number OS1, touchdowned at Travis AFB, California. Piloted by Majors Georga R. Total flying time was 14 hours and 29 minutes, about one hour chead of schedule.

Loaving Honolulu at 1110 with a crow of four which included 1st Lt Gilbert T Fujimoto from the 169th AC&W as navigator and T/Sgt Henry Y Acki as flight nochanic the tiny aircraft was doing 112 knots or 168 mph.
