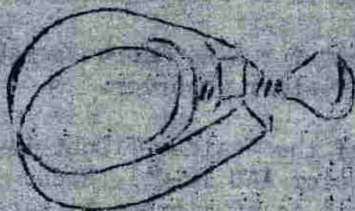

**\$3 MILLION ESTIMATE
ON 30-DAY FOOD STOCKPILE**

According to Maj Gen F.W. Makinney, the Territory's Civil Defense Director, it would cost \$3 million to stockpile enough food to last Hawaii's citizens for 30 days in a civil defense emergency. The rough estimate was presented to Governor William Quinn. In addition to food purchasing costs, another \$450,000 a year would be needed to administer the stockpiling program.
