

APT SCORE REVISED

"Those APT's are going to get tougher", remarked 1st Lt. Carl Thoene Jr., Squadron Adjutant. He said that effective with the January '59 testing cycle, minimum qualifying scores for five and seven level Airman Proficiency Tests are now 90 and 100 respectively. Formerly they were 85 and 95.

Lt. Thoene declared that before an airman can be administered a five level test, he must have a minimum of sixty days actual experience appropriate to the skill level for which he is being tested. This requires one year attendance at drills (48 in all) and 15 days summer encampment. For seven level testing, an airman

must have ninety days experience which is obtained by one and one-half years of drill attendance plus 15 days summer encampment. Prior requirements were six months for the five level and a year for the seven.

Another change in the training schedule has been made for greater OJT emphasis. Effective with this month's drill, the Squadron has been divided into two operational units. Operations Officers and tactical pilots will drill on one week end supported by Aircraft Maintenance in air technician status (full time Squadron employees); the remainder of the Squadron will drill on another week-end with limited flying time on an additional flying training period basis.

Lt. Thoene added, however, that service school attendance, correspondence courses, and comparable civilian employment were other criteria used to evaluate an airman's proficiency to take the various skill level tests. He further commented that this "tightening up" was in keeping with the airman and NCO Quality Control Program which aimed to get the most qualified person for the job.

The change was instituted in order to give the bulk of the Squadron members within the maintenance area the training that they needed with no

loss in flying per month for tactical pilots. In addition, limited general military training has been programed.

NEW PROFICIENCY TEST FOR 6 FIELDS

Top ranking NCO's in six career fields set up shop at the Personnel Laboratory, Lackland Air Force Base Texas, during the last week of February to write new and revised Airman Proficiency Tests in their specialities.

Scheduled for overhaul are tests for Communications Operations(29); Aircraft Accessories Maintenance (42); Utilities (56); Food Service (62); Supply (64); and Printing (71). The new APT's will be ready for use during the August and September testing periods.

The developers of a new test are in all cases senior NCO's with considerable field experience brought in from the field to work in cooperation with professional test builders. As part of the package, test writers include a recommended study reference list which is available at all base education offices and base libraries.
