

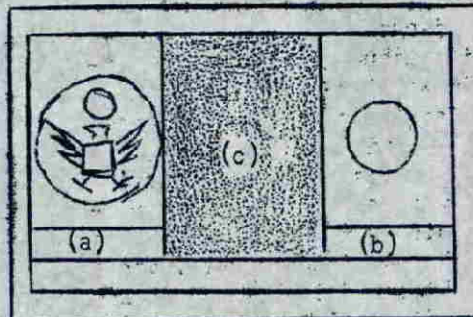




# GENERAL NEWS

UP TO DATE I.D. CARDS NOW MANDATORY

AFR 35-15, dated July 1959, covers items which must appear on Air Guardsman I.D. Cards. The following diagram shows several of the changes. If your card lacks any of this information then it is out-dated and you need a new one.



In space (A), "Grade", the card should read "Lieutenant" for both 2nd and 1st Lt. Other officer grades are spelled out. The word "Airman" should appear for A/B thru A/1C. "NCO" should appear for grades SSGT thru SR. MSGT.

Space (B) should state "Indefinite" for commissioned officers and a date of expiration of enlistment for all airmen.

A 1" X 1½" photograph should appear in space (C).

Changes on the reverse side of the card (not shown) include Rh factor in addition to blood type and person's religious preference.

Personnel Section will make arrangements to up-date your I.D. Cards. You will be notified.

Check your I.D. (dog) Tags to insure their current status also.
