NGA CONFERENCE SUCCESS

The National Guard Association wrapped up its 82nd General Conference at the Hawaiian Village Hotel's Long House with impressive closing day ceremonies. More than two thousand five hundred visitors from as far off as Alaska and Puerto Rico attended the conference, the first to be held outside the continental United States.

F-102 SOON

With the arrival of the first F-102's scheduled for early December, a number of officers and airmen have departed to the mainland for transition and check out training. Already with the 149th Fighter Group (AD), at Kelly, Air Force Base, Texas, are Col James R. Ashford, and Captains Kurt Johnson, Don Giddings, and Harold Nagai. The guard pilots left on October 20th and will be away for twenty-six days.

Slated to join them at Kelly are 1SGt's Simany Afoa Jr., Robert Jones, and Anthony Kim; TSgt Thomas T. Tsuruda; and SSgt. Jose P. Aquino. The airmen leave on October 20th.

Leaving today for Perrin Air Force Base, Texas, is Col. Jack Blanchard Air Force Senior Advisor. Following his F-102 transition and check out at Perrin, the colonel will attend the Air Defense Command/Air National Guard Conference at Ent Air Force Base, Col., and then proceed to Hughes Aircraft Corporation for a briefing on the H-10 and G/R 1 and 2 missiles. Col Blanchard will be gone about thirty days.

The five day business sessions saw some excellent addresses by top civilian Army, Air Force and Guard personnel. Opinion seemed to favor an address delivered by Hawaii's Representative, Daniel Inouye, who received a ten-minute standing ovation.

General officers and their ladies were feted at a Governor's reception at Iolani Palace. A "Blue Hat" cocktail party for the conferees was hosted by Hawaii Army and Air Guardsmen at the Hickam Air Force Base Officers Club.

What was perhaps the largest luau given in the State was held at Fort DeRussy Parade Grounds. Over three-thousand guests attended.

Most of the credit for the success of the conference is due to the efforts of the Hawaii Army and Air Guardsmen. The preparation for the luau took almost the entire week to complete. Army and Air Technicians served as bus and sedan drivers for the visitors.
