F-102 OPERATIONAL WITH HANG

The following thumbnail sketches of HQ 154th FTR GP officers are furnished for informational purposes. In the past, too many of us have not been aware of, or known who our top leaders were. So-o-o, here they are.....

Robert E. Maguire, Lt. Col., 36, Command Pilot, is our Group Comdr. The Colonel has over 18 yrs mil service and almost 17yrs flying service. He has been with the Guard since 1947 and the Gp Comdr since 1 Dec 60. Civilian-wise, he is with Hawaiian Airlines and has been Chief Pilot since 1 Jun 59.

Paāraic B. Evans, Major, 39, Command Pilot, is our Group Executive Officer. The Major also has over 18 yrs mil service and 17 yrs flying service. He has been with HANG since 1946 and our Gp Exec since March 61. Also, he is on leave from Hawaiian Airlines to fill the Base Detachment Commander's position vacated by Major Hite.

Now to the directorates.;...

George R. Duncan, Lt. Col., 39, is our Director of Materiel. Col. Duncan is one of the few remaining Charter members of the HANG, having been assigned since 1946. He has close to 19 yrs mil service and 18 yrs flying service. Prior to the Group's organization, the Colonel was Comdr 199th FI Sq. He is employed as a Captain with Hawaiian Airlines.

Letwell P.A. Duvauchelle, Major, 37, Command Pilot, is our Director of Operations. He is another Charter member of the HANG with over 18 yrs mil service and 17 yrs flying service. He is an FAA employee and has been Assistant Chief Honolulu Tower since September 1949. He works out of the new FAA building in Diamond Head.

The 199th Fighter Interceptor Squadron formally took over the controls of its new aircraft, the F-102, with a brief ceremony at the alert shack last Wednesday at 1330. *afternoon at 1330*

After nearly seven years of valiant service, the Guard's 27 F-86 Sabrejets were retired.

The F-102 now combine with the Army's Nike-Hercules surface-to-air missiles to provide the Hawaiian area with a deadly 24-hour air defense watch.

The Delta Daggers are armed with 24 folding-fin aircraft rockets plus six deadly GAR missiles. They can scramble faster and fly higher to make an intercept than its North American predecessor.

In the acceptance ceremony, Sheila Maguire, wife of the Group Commander, christened the lead plane "Pueo". Two co-ed beauties from the University of Hawaii, Gayle Adachi and Jo Ann Yamada, cadet sponsor for the squadron, presented leis to the HANG skippers.

Captains Johnson and Nagai made the first official scramble.

Four 199th aircraft led the salute to the men and women of our Armed Forces in a parade at Ala Moana Park. After the Ala Moana fly-over, two aircraft proceeded to Lihue Airport while the other two aircraft flew over General Lyman Field, Hilo. An F-102 was on display at Kahului, Maui and dummy Falcon missiles were displayed in Hilo and Kauai.

The first air-to-air missile in Hawaiian skies became reality when the 199th FIS made the F-102 operational last week.

Each F-102 carries six Falcons on launches inside the doors to its belly.

Captain John H. Beaumont and thirteen others are charged with the responsibility of preparing these "killers" for combat.

A thirty-five foot long console, consisting of readout dials, scopes, and other instruments, is used to put the Falcon through simulated test flights prior to its check out.
