NO COMMISSARY PRIVILEGES FOR DEPENDENTS

In a recent bulletin National Guard Bureau informed HANG that dependents of Air Guardsmen will no longer be allowed commissary privileges unless their sponsors are on active duty for more than thirty days.

However, ANG personnel on active duty for more than 72 hours may buy from the commissary by identifying themselves with ID card and a copy of their ders.

Dependents of Air Guard personnel on active duty for more than 72 hours may still enjoy gasoline, library, bowling, swimming, tennis, QM sales, theater, restaurant, and Base Exchange privileges by applying for Form HAJF-1, the Privilege Identification Card.

TOP LIVING U. S. ACE "JOINS" 199TH FIS

Col. Francis S. Gabreski, America's top living air ace, is among the PACAF personnel authorized to perform flying duties with the 199th Fighter Interceptor Squadron.

Col. Gabreski, now PACAF Inspector General, is credited with shooting down 40 enemy aircraft during World War II and the Korean Conflict. In Korea, he became history's eighth "jet ace" by accounting for six and a half aircraft.
