## INFORMATION ON LIBERTY PASSES

Unit commanders may allow passes for up to 50% of NCOs and 50% of airmen per flight at any one time. Airmen off-duty passes start 1600 daily, or when off-shift as approved by the First Sergeant.

Passes for CMSgts, MSgts, and SMSgts expire at 0700 or time of duty formation. Passes for other NCOs expire at 0100, and for AlC through AB at 2300 hours.

All airmen are to sign-out and signin at their unit's Orderly Room. No Armed Forces Liberty Pass form will be issued, but all airmen must carry a copy of their orders and their ID card when on pass.

# FROM A LETTER TO THE GROUP COMMANDER

# 154TH AIRMAN MAKES DISTINGUISHED RECORD

Hawaii's Air Guardsmen frequently distinguish themselves while in service school. However, the 154th is especially proud of the record made by the AP's own A3C Charles M. Bell, 154 COMSUPRON.

Airman Bell, who joined HANG in Januy of this year, was cited for outstanding achievement while attending Basic lilitary Training and Air Police Training at Lackland Air Force Base, Texas.

His military instructor reports that his "outstanding conduct and appearance both on and off duty resulted in his being recommended for the American Spirit Honor Medal...He will long be remembered by the permanent party as one of the most outstanding airmen that has ever attended this course and by the class as a friend and guide in these frequently difficult early days of their service experience..."

He was also praised for the outstanding manner in which he discharged his duties as Flight Student Leader of his class. A 1960 graduate of Kamehameha School, Bell is now employed by Hawaiian Airlines.

### PERSONNEL HONORED FOR OUTSTANDING WORK

Brig. Gen. Valentine A. Siefermann, Commander, HANG, presented awards and congratulations to 154th personnel at yesterday's morning formation. The honors conferred recognized individuals and teams for outstanding achievements.

Honored as HANG Outstanding Interceptor Pilot for 1963-1964 was the 199 FIS pilot 1Lt George E. M. Joy Jr. Lt. Joy, a firefighter for the Honolulu Fire Department, demonstrated outstanding and noteworthy performance of duties. Lt Joy joined HANG in 1956.

Honored as Outstanding HANG Airman was TSgt Leslie I. Nakashima of the 15% USAF Dispensary. A UH graduate in medical technology, Sgt Nakashima started in HANG as a Weather Observer for the 199 Forecasting Flight in 1953. Since 1957 he has been assigned in medical work. He works as a Medical Laboratory Technician in his civilian job. Nakashima was chosen for distinguished ability and leadership.

Also honored were members of the winning team in OPERATION BEERCAN FLING, a flying competition which had been underway since last Wednesday. Patterned after the Ricks Event, this test of air defense fighter interceptor mission capabilities compare the effectiveness of participating teams and individuals on fire control, GCI procedures, and aircrew ability.

Winners of the hardfought and closely contested competition was B Flight of 199 FTS, commanded by Maj Ross England. Flying members of the team were Captains Alex, Bell, Joseph Ah New, Marlin Little, and Lts George Kuroda and Donham Walker.

Members of the hardworking support team was Team #2 under Team Chief SSgt Abraham Forges. Members of his team included crew chiefs Tsgt Alvin Johnson
