NEW CLOTHING ALLOWANCE SYSTEM FOR ANG

The Air National Guard will implement the Air Force Monetary Clothing Allowance System with a target date of 1 October 1964.

Under the new system airmen will no longer be issued uniform items and replacements, but will be given cash allowances to maintain and replace clothing items. Purchases are to be made from the Air Force Clothing Sales store.

Prior to implementing the new system all airmen will be processed through HANG BEMO for a thorough clothing check so that unserviceable clothing and items in the wrong sizes may be turned in. Unit commanders will be notified of clothing check schedules.

The clothing check will also insure that every airman will have all authorized items. HANG personnel will be issued the same allowances as are provided active duty personnel, including winter blues, underwear, and towels.

Amounts to be received and detailed information on the transition from the old to the new system will be announced during the next few months.
