

FILLD TRAINING DATES

ANG TRANSFER PROCEDURES

Field training dates for Fiscal Year 1967 for the following organizations of this Group (assigned attached to SUPRON and Hq. 154th Fighter Group).

a. CAMRON, SUPRON & COMSUPRON (Less personnel attached to SUPRON and Hq 154th Righter Group).

1. 27 March-2 April 1967 (7 days).

2. 5-11 June 1967 (7 days).

3. 1 day small arms firing (to be announced later).

b. HFG, FIS, DISP & WEA:

1. 27 March-1 April 1967 (6 days).

2. 5-10 June 1967 (6 days).

3. 2 days (scheduled on mutually agreed dates between the individual and unit commander).

4. 1 day (small arms firing to be announced later by COMSUPRON Commander). (Apply to HFG, FIS and Wea personnel-airmen).

5. 1 day (DISP personnel-Support unit commanders by providing medics on duty at firing range).

Personnel who did not receive a "Letter to Employer" should contact their First Sergeant during February 1967 ADAs.

All ANG personnel wishing to transfer to another State Air National Guard unit must take the following action prior to departure from Hawaii:

a. Submit a request for position vacancy to the ANG unit to which transfer is desired at least two months prior to departure from Hawaii.

b. Upon receipt of notification that a position vacancy is available for you, notify your commander immediately. At the same time submit a request for conditional release and excusal of attendance of UTA (utilizing HANG form 40) or authorization to perform appropriate duty until you are appointed or enlisted in the ANG of another state. Also arrange for base charance (conditional release will not be approved until base clearance is received by CBPC.

c. Your unit will forward request for conditional release and excusal from UTA or authorization to perform appropriate duty to CBPO for further action.

d. CBPO will forward your conditional release and authorization to perform appropriate duty to the ANG unit to which transfer is desired. Approved HANG Form 40 mill be furnished you prior to your departure.
