HANG has three flight surgeons, Lt Col Claude E. Caver, Major Gerald C. Anderson and Major Casimir Jasinski. They give flying medical exams and conduct aviation medicine programs research.

HANG also has one general Medical Doctor, Major Arthur W. Gay, and all four men are on duty during drill, just in case you catch a cold or something.

AIR TECHNICIAN VACANCIES

Positions for an ACU Supervisor and a Radio Maintenance Techn. are open with the Air Guard.

Applicants for the ACU job must have four or more years in the ACU operations area, and have AFSC 27370 or the equivalent. They must have normal color vision, eyesight correctable to 20/20, and the appropriate security clearance. The suspense date for applications is June 8.

The Radio Techn position requires at least three years of experience in the ground radio maintenance field in either a military or civilian position, and he must have AFSC 30454 or equivalent. Color vision must be normal. Some USAF ground radio maintenance training is desirable. The suspense date for applications for this position is May 25.
