COMMISSARY, EXCHANGE PRIVILEGES

With HANG field training in the very near future, it is apropos to review the regulations for commissary and exchange privileges.

To be eligible for commissary and exchange privileges, an ANG member must be ordered to active duty or active duty for training for a period of over 72 hours before he and his dependent are eli-

Dependents other than legal wife and children must first have their dependency established by the AF Accounting and Finance Center. In order to have access to the AF Commissary/Army & AF Exchanges, dependents must have in their possession one copy of the authenticated order and driver's license or other civilian identification card.

For alert duty or individual short tours of over 72 hours and 30 days or less, the ANG member must submit his request for his dependent to HANG CHPO or through his unit. During unit or all-HANG field training, units will consolidate all requests to HANG CHPO. The individual may personally report to CHPO for dependent's commissary and exchange privileges by presenting a copy of his orders. All requests will contain the dependent's name and relationship.

Emergency services have almost doubled for the all-volunteer organization, with 363 missions thru mid-November compared to 273 the previous year and 21 lives saved, compared with 10 in 1967.

Mobilization of Air National Guard units last January prevented "a major confrontation similar to the Berlin Crisis from happening in Korea," according to MGen Winston P. Wilson, National Guard Bureau Chief.

Wilson and his staff spent two days visiting nearly 3,000 activated Guardsmen throughout Korea.

"In the past, calling up the reserves has always been a sign that we mean business," Wilson said. "Perhaps that's why we don't have a shooting war over here."

Three Air National Guard units mobilized early this year will be released from active duty Dec. 20, some four months earlier than originally planned. Demobilization of all 16,000 Air Guard and Air Force Reserve forces activated in January and May is scheduled for completion by June 30.
