NOMURA NAMED ONE OF TOP FIVE AIRMEN AMONG U.S. GUARDSMEN

Congrats to SSgt George T. Nomura of the Comptroller Office of 154th Supply Squadron, who recently received Honorable Mention in the Outstanding Airman Competition conducted annually by the National Guard Bureau. Sgt Nomura has the distinction of ranking among the top five Airmen who represent the cream of the crop of all Air Guardsmen throughout the nation.

"Ssgt Nomura enlisted in the Hawaii Air National Guard on 12 August 1964. Since then he has maintained perfect attendance in all unit activities and has displayed keen awareness of military ideas in self-study. He was promoted to his present rank on an accelerated basis. SSgt Nomura's proficiency is further exemplified by the HANG Base Accounting Manual which he prepared and compiled. This manual now serves as a guide for the Comptroller and all accounting personnel.

"SSgt Nomura possesses the innate distinctive and learned qualities of a leader. He has continually demonstrated leadership effectiveness beyond his present rank. On the other hand, he is always open to constructive criticism and is adaptable to new goals and techniques. His efforts towards self-evaluation mark him as a person whose upward mobility will be enhanced by those around him.

"As a morale builder, SSgt Nomura has provided the impetus that played an important role in his section attaining an outstanding IG inspection rating. He was partially responsible for the formation of the Comptroller Office social club which was established primarily to promote harmonious working conditions among its members as well as to provide a stronger feeling of group unity. GUARDSMEN DEMOBILIZED

The Air Force has announced the demobilization schedule of Air Force Reserve and Air National Guard personnel called to active duty in January and May of last year.

Some 16,000 men and more than 370 fighter and transport aircraft were added to the active force by the mobilization under Congressional authority provided in the Department of Defense Appropriation Act of 1967. The Act provides that the president may, when he deems it necessary, order to active duty any unit of the Ready Reserve for a period up to 24 months.

In October, Secretary of Defense Clark M. Clifford announced that the Air Force was starting actions to return all of the mobilized units to inactive status by June 30, 1969. Three Reserve and three Air Guard units, totaling almost 2,400 men, were released in December.

The balance of the reserve forces will be released in seven increments starting April 30 and ending June 18.
