IF YOU'VE BEEN DRAFTED--YOU CAN STILL GET IN THE GUARD

WASHINGTON, D.C.---Effective 1 July 1972 Selective Service registrants who have been issued a notice to report for induction may enlist or accept an appointment in the Army or the Air National Guard provided the date of enlistment or appointment is at least ten days prior to the scheduled reporting date for induction.

In the case of a registrant whose induction reporting date has been postponed, the enlistment or appointment in the Army or Air National Guard will be valid if it is accomplished at least ten days prior to the rescheduled reporting date.

Registrants who have been issued a notice to report for induction on one of the first 15 days July 1972 will be afforded an opportunity by selective service to enlist or accept an appointment in the Army or Air National Guard. Local selective service boards have been authorized to postpone the induction reporting date for not more than 15 days if requested by the registrant. This action is designed to assure equitable treatment for the individuals concerned.

This change will afford the Army or Air National Guard opportunity to capitalize on a group previously not available. The liberalized policy opens the door for

recruiters to seek out these potential accessions and induce them to enlist.

RECRUITS NEEDED

The National Guard Bureau allotted 20 spaces to HANG for the July, August, September quarter but, as of this writing, 10 have been lost since reporting dates have passed.

HANG MAKES BIG SPLASH IN PARADE

Kailua's 4th of July parade was privileged to have the first HANG float in many years, an effort sponsored by chapter 18 of the ANG NCO Academy Graduates Association.

Theme of the parade was Apollo, honoring America's space effort. HANG's float utilized a practice recovery capsule from the Manned Spacecraft Recovery Force, Pacific on a trailer driven by SMSgt Richard Miles. Our own WAF, Phyllis Dickson, was sitting on it and also on the float were five Guardsmen, four in uniform and one with a gas pump representing the citizen-soldier. Slogans read "Air Guardsman Citizen Soldiers; Duty, Honor, Country; Defenders of Air Space; and Aloha Apollo as well as Hawaii Air National Guard." The float carried six large American flags and 96 4" x 6" flags.

SPACE AVAILABLE TRAVEL BY C-54

Thirty spaces are available for booking on the HANG C-54 flights of 21-23 July, and 36 on 28-30 July.

The flight on the 21st departs for Hilo and Maui at 1730 and returns on the 23rd, leaving Maui at 1630 and Hilo at 1830.
