DISPENSARY TO TEST AT WAIMAND HOME

HANG's 154th USAF Dispensary, in line with its goal for wider involvement in community affairs, has announced plans for a mass TB and Flu immunization program to be held Saturday, 21 October at the Waimano Training Center.

The State Institution, in Waipahu, cares for severely mentally and physically handicapped persons who have little chance of adapting to the routine of a life outside the facility.

According to Air Guard health service administrator Captain James Hardin, about 20 volunteers, or two-thirds of the entire unit will be involved in the program. After being bused to Waimano, the R.N.s and medical corpsmen will work in five teams of three. The Guardsmen hope to test all of the 700 patients at the center in one day.

This Saturday's project follows earlier immunization programs by the Dispensary, among them Operation Swallow, an early introduction to oral vaccine in Hawaii, and the

FORMER HANG PILOT DIES ON COAST

Maj. Franklin H. Fukui, a former tactical pilot with the 199 FIS died Tuesday night 26 September of cancer at Stanford Hospital at Palo Alto, California.

At the time of his death he was a member of the 149th FIS at Fresno. He was a civilian pilot with Pan Am.

He was buried at Punchbowl on 4 Oct in a military ceremony with a 199th FIS missing man formation flyby.

Major Fukui joined the Air Guard in March 1954, was an aviation cadet in May of '57, and transferred to California in Sep of '66.
