
ORI Strikes

The Operational Readiness Inspection phase of this year's MEI is underway for the 326th Arr Division and the Hawaii Air National Guard.

The Inspector General,
HQ PACAF, initiated the
inspection under the authority
of AFR 123-1. The purpose of the
ORI is to verify the operational
readiness status of each unit and
to evaluate the support provided
by subordinate, lateral and higher echelon units.

The Management Effectiveness portion of the inspection will not occur until December. Specifically, the 154th will undergo an MEI Dec. 4-9, the 150th ACWS Dec. 4-7 and the 169th ACWS Dec. 8-9.

The MEI will include mangement evaluations of all functions of the units. The injection serves as an assessment of our capabilities to perform the mission. With the recall this morning, the sment begins.







A head and shoulders photograph of a toothless old man wearing a pilot's helmet reached popularity among many Air Force people...without the original photographer knowing it.

During the past 25 years, the photo has circulated around the world. Many have seen it on a poster that reads "Sleep well tonight. Your Air Force is awake."

Not until recently, though, was the photo's origin known. Nick Allen of Orangeville, Calif. and a friend, Maj. David Crippen, from Mather came across the original black and white photo of the toothless pilot while looking through Allen's portfolio. Both were surprised when the major recognized the familiar photo. That's when Mr. Allen learned of its fame.

The photo was taken in 1957 while Mr. Allen was attending photography school. "In the

evening I worked in the photo lab at Hughes Aircraft in Culver City, Calif. One evening while on break, I passed the pilots' flight gear room," he said. "I stopped to talk to the janitor, who looked to be in his seventies."

"Suddenly, he put one of the helmets on, took out his teeth and started grinning. His expression was too great to pass, so I asked him to wait while I went for my camera," Mr. Allen said. Mr. Allen took about a dozen shots.

Later, when some of the Hughes Aircraft staff saw one of the photos they published it as a filler in the company's weekly newspaper, the Hughes News. The newspaper had a circulation outside the company so more than just a few people saw the photo.

Allen worked for two more years at Hughes and gave away other photo copies to friends. After leaving the company, he never thought


about the photo.

Since then, however, the photo has been copyrighted. Mr. Allen has made limited numbers of prints available for sale.

The janitor unfortunately will never be known. Allen says he never wrote his name down anywhere, and it's been so many years that he doesn't remember.
