
At the end of this month Thanksgiving

# SAFETY NOTES

HAWAII'S NEW SAFETY BELT LAW

MANDATORY USE OF SEAT BELTS HRS Chapter 291-

Drivers must use seat belts when operating motor vehicles.

Drivers must see to it that front seat passengers under 15 are properly restrained by belts.

Passengers fifteen years of age and older in the front seat of a motor vehicle are required and are responsible for being restrained in their seat belts.

Exemptions:
Passengers in emergency,
commercial, for hire, mass transit
vehicles and type 1 school buses.

Persons shall not be guilty if:

1. They are in a motor vehicle that is not required to have seat belts.

2. They are not in a seat belt because there are more persons than there are seat belts and all the belts are being used.

3. They have medically certified physical disabilities which prevents them from being restrained.

PENALTY: \$15 fine for each violation.
Effective 12/16/85

Note: From 12/16/85 to 12/31/88, there will be a 10% reduction in No-Fault Insurance premium charges for motor vehicles equipped with the required seat belt assemblies.

# COCAINE:

# THE DRUG

Most people want to believe that they are intelligent, in control, a good communicator, on top of their job and on the road to success. The majority of people believe they have the above characteristics because they have developed a positive self-image. A few believe they possess the characteristics mentioned above because they use cocaine.

Cocaine is an unpredictable, phsychologically addictive drug that can have you believing that you are:

- s more in control of the situation; and
- can perform high quality work even when you're down.

These foelings are nothing more than the products of your mind and are in fact part of the cocaine mythology. The truth is that cocaine is a stimulant. It gives you a burst of energy for about 30 minutes or so then sends you crashing into depression. While up (that is, after inhaling, smoking, swallowing or injecting cocaine) you will have an illusion of being in control, of feeling more energetic, of acting more sociable and of power. Those around you are most likely to report that you were talkative, overconfident and advocated simplistic solutions to your problems. Your perception and assessment of your own behavior would be inaccurate - the drug cocaine would be controlling your reali-

The best treatment for cocaine abuse is abstinence - don't ever start. If you've experimented with the drug - stop. If you want more information about Cocaine, drug and/or alcohol abuse talk to Social Actions. We have a library full of helpful pamphlets.
