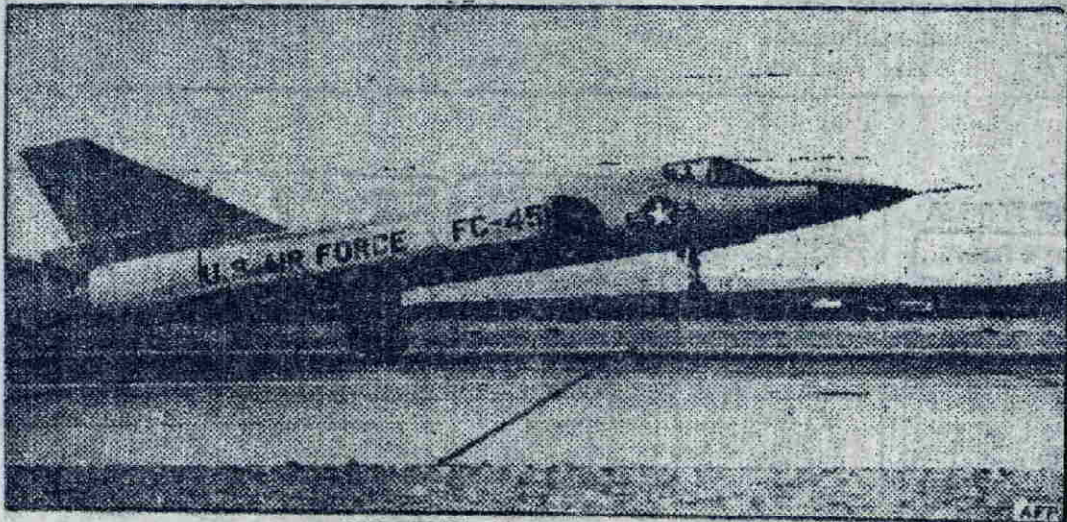

## "THE SMOKE-EATERS

SMELL SMOKE! SEE FLAMES! THEN TELEPHONE 117! In a jiffy, the Fire-Fighters of the 199th FIS, HANG, race to the rescue. Their big red trucks roar to a halt and in a matter of seconds the "smoke eaters", under the direction of T/Sgt Thomas Bowers, have the blaze under control. Ever wonder what a fireman does?

His first concern is the rescue of personnel. He administers emergency first aid when necessary. He then, naturally, puts out the fire. After the fire is extinguished, he removes his equipment and provides temporary storage for it in a safe place. He must also insure that evidence is preserved in order to determine the cause of the fire. These men deal with aircraft as well as structural fires. In their "spare time", they maintain all equipment, operate a fire alarm communication system, and supervise both fire prevention and fire hazard inspections.

The 199th can certainly boast of a well-experienced crew. Under T/Sgt Thomas Bowers's supervision, who has over fifteen years experience in fire-fighting, are the following airmen: S/Sgt Merlin L. White Jr, who is employed at the Honolulu Fire Department, and A/lc William Gonsalves, who works at Hickam Supply. Both airmen have over five years experience. There is A/2c Thomas Okazaki, a steel worker with Hawaiian Reinforcing Steel Company, and A/lc Roger Hine, who is with the CAA. These men have worked three and two years, respectively, in the field.

Other airmen assigned to the Fire-Fighter Element are: A/2c Lawrence Amaki, A/3c Rupert Okinaga, A/3c Michael Lachado, and A/3c Hiram Lau. These airmen are students at the University of Hawaii.
