Going inside, you will find S/Sgt Paulino Yonting, the section chief, busy at his job. Sgt Yonting is a veteran sheetmetal man with sixteen years experience. On several occasions, he has been called upon by our regular AF comrades at Hickam for assistance..true testimony of his skill .

In fact, the Sheetmetal Shop claims several experienced men. For instance, there's A/1C Soprayano Salvador. He has been in commercial sheetmetal for fifteen years and aircraft sheetmetal for over a year and a half. A/2C Ceferino Agor, another member of this team, has had three and a half years aircraft sheetmetal experience. A/2C Joseph Tom, a graduate of Honolulu Vocational School, has done commercial work for five years. The Army National Guard is seeking qualified officers and enlisted personnel for Army Aviation Flight Training. Applicants must not be in grade higher than First Lieutenant, not over thirty years of age, weigh no more than 200 pounds, and be no taller than 76 inches in height. Previous flying experience is not necessary.

The training program is approximately seven months in duration. Sixteen weeks primary flight training at Camp Gary, Texas; and Thirteen weeks aviation tactics at Fort Rucker, Alabama.
