Le May's COMMENTS

Gen Curtis LeMay, Vice Chief of Staff, US-AF, caused quite a stir with his hard-hitting comments about the AF Reserve and the Air National Guard.

According to AF Times LeMay remarked that the Air Force would not, in his opinion, need two reserves; that two different systems were "inresicient and costly";

one reserve wasugh; and that its "tactical role" will diminish in the next 10 years as weapons continue to become increasingly complex.

The general added, however, that his stand was a personal one and that his remarks were made to "stimulate thought".

In a message distributed Air Force-wide this week, Gen Thomas D. White, USAF Chief of Staff, made clear the AF's attitude on the present and future roles of the Air Force Reserve components.
