

WASHINGTON LETTER

QUOTES FROM WASHINGTON NEWSLETTER. VOL. VIII, NO. 2 1 May 1973.

INTEREST IN SURVIVOR BENEFIT. for National Guardsmen and Reservists continuew to grow. Like NGAUS, the Reserve Officers Association is pushing hard for the legislation. H.R. 3468, introduced earlier this year by Congressman Montgomery would authorize payment of a portion of the earned retirement annuity to the widow of a Guardsman or Reservist who dies before reaching age 60. Maj Gen Henry W McMillan, NGAUS President, is writing all members of Senate and House asking that they support the legislation.

SCLI IS MOVING -- toward a vote in the House, probably early in May. House Veterans' Affairs Committee favorably reported the bill, including authorization for withholding premiums for State Association insurance. Meanwhile, Senator Harke of Indiana, Chairman of Senate Veterans' Affairs Committee, is planning to introduce a similar bill and hold hearings, probably mid-late may. Are your Senators aware of the legislation and favorably inclined??????????????????
