Statement of Need for Hazmat Operations and Hazmat Awareness Courses

1. Description of the minimum need for the following request:

a. NGB Required Training: The HAZMAT Operations and Awareness Classes are a NGB required pre-requisite class for ALL CERFP personnel prior to them becoming authorized and “Legal” members to perform duties within the CERFP.

b. Qualified Instructors:

(1) HAZMAT Operations and HAZMAT Awareness Class 06-08 November 2018. This must be an IFSAC and PROBOARD Certified instructed course.

(2) Must have instructors able to test and IFSAC certify the students and provide an IFSAC Certificate upon completion of test processing.

(3) Must have instructors who have trained CERFPs, HRFs, and Hazmat Teams across the country and have worked with JITEC and are familiar with the CERFP’s Training and Evaluation Outline (T&EOs).

c. Course Requirements:

(1) Must be able to train up to 50 personnel.

(2) Must have instructors provide their own training materials and equipment for the following: Damming, Diking, Diverting classes, Air Monitoring instruments to identify and classify hazardous materials, and PPE to include Level A, B, C and Decontamination process.

d. Training: HAZMAT Course must include the following NFPA 472, Chapter 5, 6.2 and 6.6, 2018 Edition, Mission Specific Competencies (MSC):

(1) The end result of the training is for each student to receive an IFSAC Certified Certificate of training for both Hazmat Operations and Hazmat Awareness.

(2) In order to receive an IFSAC training certificate each student must take and pass a written examination in both Hazmat Operations and Hazmat Awareness and show proficiency with hands-on skills and equipment discussed and taught in the course.
