Single Entry Criteria

“The **Single entry criteria** applies to all COMPO Soldiers and is based on complex case management. ARCP Single Entry Criteria. Soldier has, or is anticipated to receive, a **profile of more than 6 months duration, with duty limitations** that preclude the Soldier from training or contributing to unit mission accomplishment; the **complexity of the Soldier’s condition requires** either **clinical case management** or the Soldier’s **psychological condition is** evaluated by a qualified licensed medical or behavioral health (BH) provider as **posing a substantial danger to self or others** if Soldier remains in the parent unit.”

Ineligibility

- Soldier at MRDP or in IDES → (ETP).
- Pregnancy. → Exception if referred for other qualifying conditions for which treatment does not interfere with pregnancy.
- Pending Military Occupational Specialty Administrative Retention Review (MAR2).
- On Temporary Disability Retirement List (TDRL).
- Soldiers pending / undergoing UCMJ, other legal actions, investigations, or Line of Duty determinations → (ETP for LOD only).
- SUDCC failure.

“**Complex Care** is defined by TSG as: ‘A medical professional aggregate assessment based upon the **severity of illness, degree of impairment, required level of comprehensive care management, and commitments of time and re-sources.**’ Definition allows medical professionals to make assessments based on each Soldier’s overall medical situation, treatment needs, and the **availability of care in geographically dispersed locations.**”
