What's FEMA's Hazard Mitigation Grant Program (HMGP)?

It's a funding opportunity open to counties, states, and certain private non-profits to reduce or eliminate the long-term risk to human life and property from hazards. There is a 25% required local match (cash or in-kind).

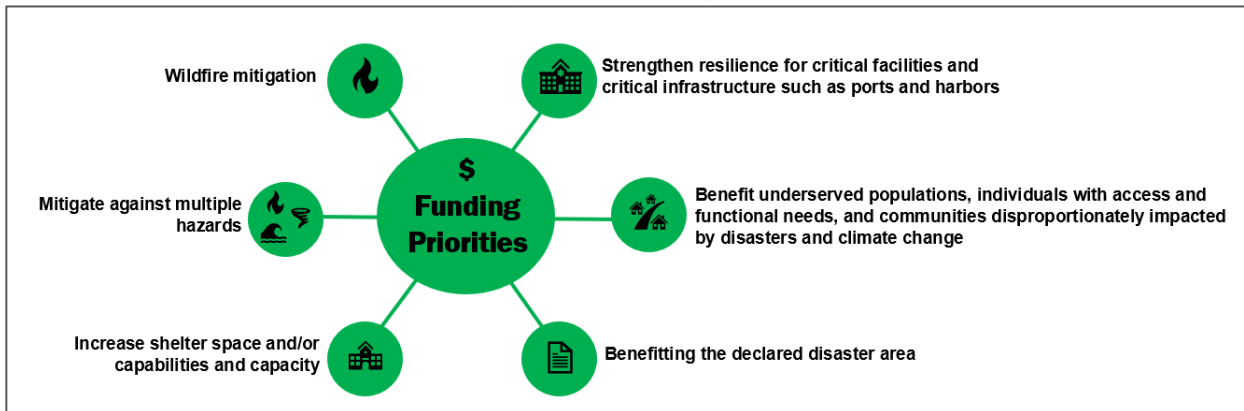
Deadlines:

- ❖ 02/06/2029 – Projects completed

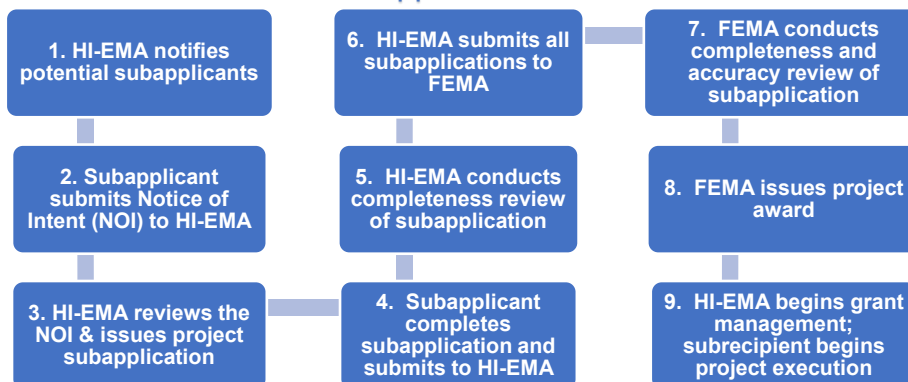
What are some eligible projects?

- Designs, Studies, and Advance Assistance (when you know you want to mitigate against a hazard but don't know the best option)
- Coastal, inland, floodplain protection, and dry floodproofing (coral reef restoration, sand dune restoration, and sea level rise, etc.)
- Soil stabilization, landslides, and erosion control
- Community rain and stormwater harvesting and flood mitigation
- Energy, water, communications redundancy (generators, microgrids, microwave/radio systems, etc.)
- Hurricane wind retrofitting, earthquake hardening of existing buildings, especially critical facilities, and infrastructure
- Defensible space and hazardous fuels reduction
- Outreach and education
