NO SPARKS



- Put campfires and BBQs out cold. Keep water and/or shovels nearby.
- Be wildfire-smart when you use equipment. Do not use equipment that could spark on dry, windy days or near dry grass and brush.
- Keep vehicles off dry grass. Carry a fire extinguisher in your vehicle.
- Practice firework safety. Attend a public show instead of using home fireworks.

PREPARE YOUR HOME & YARD



- Keep your yard lean, clean, and green. Remove leaf piles and dead/dying vegetation from yard, home gutters, and anywhere they accumulate.
- Use non-combustible building materials.
- Keep a 5-foot combustible-free zone around your home.

PREPARE YOUR FAMILY



- Coordinate with your family a protocol for emergencies. Practice your plan.
- Keep important numbers on hand.
- Include pets in your planning, as well as neighbors who might need assistance.
- Keep a go-bag with your family's essentials in an easy-to-reach place.
- Do not wait for an evacuation order to leave. Avoid evacuation traffic and leave roads open for emergency responders. You can always return home.

STAY INFORMED



- Pay attention to seasonal changes in wildfire. Notice when the landscape is drying out. Wildfire risk increases during dry hot, and windy conditions.
- Stay alert and follow given instructions during an emergency.
- Sign up for your county and state emergency alerts.
