**STATEWIDE DISASTER CASE MANAGEMENT PROGRAM (DCMP):
FACT SHEET**

DCMPs connect those affected by disasters with specially trained Disaster Case Managers (DCMs) to help assess and address their needs by developing a disaster recovery plan. DCMs then provide guidance and refer those impacted by disasters to available resources, including housing navigation, financial recovery planning, connection to federal and state benefits and referrals to community-based organizations equipped to provide long-term, localized support.

Partner Organizations



The Hawai'i Emergency Management Agency (HIEMA) is leading the Hawai'i Statewide DCMP, with support from multiple community-based organizations to help support those affected by Hurricane Lowell, Hurricane Lala, the Kona Earthquake or the Kona Low storms. This includes Aloha United Way, Global Empowerment Mission and Family Promise of Hawai'i to administer the program, as well as Aloha House, Catholic Charities of Hawai'i, Our Kupuna, Partners in Development Foundation, Project Vision and Vibrant Hawai'i to provide additional direct services on each island.

HIEMA is closely coordinating with each county and local partners to ensure a cohesive and trauma-informed disaster response that is aligned with individual communities' needs.

Statewide DCMP Eligibility

Anyone directly affected by Hurricane Lowell, Hurricane Lala, the Kona Earthquake or the Kona Low storms and in need of support may be eligible for the Statewide DCMP.
