 - A. <u>Project Manager</u>: A competent and experienced "Project Manager" shall be provided by the Contractor for not less than two (2) hours per day whenever work is being performed other than trash and debris pick-up. In the absence of the Project Manager, the Contractor will appoint a crew foreman or employee who will be responsible to ensure that the work is (i) being accomplished in an expeditious manner, (ii) performed in accordance with the contract specifications, and (iii) progress is being made without undue delay. The Project Manager must

have no less than two (2) years' experience as a direct supervisor of a commercial construction operation that includes surveying, soil excavation, and site construction in industrial, commercial and/or public sites. The Project Manager will ensure all specifications are being met, ensure contract work does not conflict with ceremonies and funerals, and ensure employees are adequately supervised and proper conduct is maintained.

 - A. C. Turf Establishment Watering: At present, there is no active irrigation system at this site to establish turf; however, there are hose bib connections available in the cemetery and current maintenance personnel may use their own irrigation equipment. Current maintenance personnel believe that the geographical location of this site is conducive with sufficient rainfall to maintain healthy turf and use lawn sprinklers when necessary during dry periods. This statement does not absolve the Contractor from his requirement to provide temporary watering as needed to produce healthy turf. The Contractor will be required to coordinate and oversee all work to ensure that his efforts are actually producing healthy turf. All existing irrigation equipment shall remain and be protected throughout construction and maintain all vegetation (including trees) until the end of the Contractor shall replace all irrigation equipment damaged by construction operations with exact manufacturer and model originally installed or accepted by the HIENG-DR at no additional cost. Contractor shall provide a temporary irrigation system for new planting areas. The temporary irrigation system shall consist of commercial-quality equipment and products and shall be maintained by the Contractor throughout the maintenance period. Contractor shall pay for all water used for construction, including a County approved water meter and reduced pressure backflow preventer. The Contractor's irrigation system (including all pipes, connections, hoses, etc.) shall be secured and protected from vehicles and pedestrians.

- 28. Section A.6.5.F. After the word "GRASSPAVE 2" where it occurs in this paragraph, insert "NDS EZ Roll Grass".

 - A. The Contractor shall provide all labor, parts, equipment, supplies, transportation and personnel required to provide grave marker cleaning services. The cleaning shall consist of cleaning grave markers at MVC. Grave markers include flat markers (i.e., marble, granite, bronze) and upright headstones (i.e. marble, granite) of varying sizes and shapes.
 - B. Contractor shall submit the cleaning methods/procedures and cleaning product information/MSDS that will be used to clean the grave markers to the HIENG-DR for approval.

- A. Work shall be accomplished in phases. The grave marker adjustment and realignment work in a phase shall be completed and accepted by the HIENG-DR before grass can be installed. The Contractor may proceed to the next phase after the grave marker adjustment and realignment work has been accepted and grass initially installed (start of the 90-day establishment period). After a phase is substantially completed (i.e., marker cleaning completed and turf established) and accepted by the HIENG-DR, the phase area shall be reopened to the public.

NOTE:

- 1. Although the project will be awarded within 60 days of the bid opening, the Notice to Proceed (NTP) will be issued no earlier than August 1, 2018 and no later than October 31, 2018, due to various circumstances beyond the state's control. Therefore, the Contractor shall prepare his/her bid based on the projected NTP date window. The contract duration noted above shall begin on the date the NTP is issued.
- 2. Coordination with Other Prime Contractors
 - a. The Contractor is hereby informed that at the time of this solicitation, there is an existing and concurrent Department of Defense, Maui Veterans Cemetery Expansion project being administered by the Department of Accounting and General Services (DAGS) that includes work within the existing cemetery property. However, due to litigation, that project's work has temporarily been stopped, and it is unknown when the project will restart and continue to completion. As such, construction of this Gravesite Restoration for Maui Veterans Cemetery, Phase II project may overlap and be performed concurrently with the DAGS project. In addition, due to the litigation, changes that are not yet finalized are anticipated to be made to the design of the DAGS project within the existing cemetery property. Although not limited to the following, the primary areas of concern for coordination of work includes the following work within the existing cemetery property under the DAGS's contractor for the Maui Veterans Cemetery Expansion project: 1) New irrigation system to be installed on the existing cemetery, 2) Demolition of trees and fencing along the east and north perimeters of the existing cemetery, and 3) New entry and roadway improvements which will require shared access. - b. Therefore, the Contractor shall be responsible to cooperate and coordinate activities, at no additional cost to the state, that include, but are not limited to sequence of work, protective barriers and any other areas of work interfacing with the DAGS Contractor, and other contractors who may be present at the Maui Veterans Cemetery. The Contractor shall provide continuity of finishes, walks, landscaping, etc. at abutting contract limits so no additional work will be required. Any damage to the DAGS Contractor's work, or the work of other contractors who may be present committed by this Contractor (or his subcontractors) shall be repaired promptly at no additional cost to the State.
- c. Coordinate Subcontractors and keep them informed of any work from the other Projects that may affect the site or the Subcontractor's work. If the Contractor has any questions regarding its coordination responsibilities or needs clarification as to the impact in scheduling of its work and the work of other projects, this Contractor shall notify the HIENG-Designated Representative (DR) in writing.
- d. Subject to approval by the HIENG-DR, this Contractor shall amend and schedule its work and operations to minimize disruptions to the work and operations of other projects.
 - 1) Relocate or remove and replace temporary barriers, fencing supports or bracing to allow work by others to proceed unimpeded. Do not remove required barriers supporting work until specified time or as approved by the HIENG-DR. This does not relieve the Contractor of the responsibility of proper coordination of the work. If directed by the HIENG-DR, leave in place any temporary barriers.
 - 2) Coordinate work that abuts or overlaps work of the other projects with the HIENG-DR and other Prime Contractors to mutual agreement so that work is 100 percent complete with continuity of all materials, systems and finishes.
 - When directed by the HIENG-DR, provide access into the construction zone to allow the other project's Contractor(s) to perform their Work and work that must be interfaced.
 - 4) Contractor shall adjust and coordinate its Work and operations as required by the other projects as part of the Work of this contract without additional cost or delay to the State.
 - 5) When directed by the HIENG-DR provide a combined Contractor's construction schedule.
- 3. Davis-Bacon Act prevailing wage rate or State wage rates apply to this contract.
- 4. Contract will be awarded based on the total lump sum bid.

- 6. The State reserves the right to determine the extent of the contract by selecting and/or omitting bid items (not necessarily in sequence) to the extent required to come within the funds available for the project. The award of the contract shall be made to the responsible bidder whose total bid is the lowest.
- 7. CAMPAIGN CONTRIBUTIONS BY STATE AND COUNTY CONTRACTORS PROHIBITED. If awarded a contract in response to this solicitation, offeror agrees to comply with HRS §11-355, which states that campaign contributions are prohibited from a State and County government contractor during the term of the contract if the contractor is paid with funds appropriated by the legislative body between the execution of the contract through the completion of the contract.
- 8. The Surety shall not be held liable beyond two (2) years of the project acceptance date.

HAWAII PRODUCTS PREFERENCE

In accordance with ACT 175, SLH 2009 the Hawaii Products preference is applicable to this solicitation. Hawaii products may be available for those items noted on the offer form. The Hawaii Products List is available on the State Procurement Office (SPO) website at http://spo.hawaii.gov/ search for "Hawaii Product Preferences".

Offeror offering a Hawaii Product (HP) shall identify the HP on the solicitation offer pages. Any person desiring a Hawaii product preference shall have the product(s) certified and qualified if not currently on the Hawaii Products list, prior to the deadline for receipt of offer(s) specified in the procurement notice and solicitation. The responsibility for certification and qualification shall rest upon the person requesting the preference.

Persons desiring to qualify their product(s) not currently on the Hawaii Product list shall complete form SPO-38, *Certification for Hawaii Product Preference*, and submit to the Department of Defense, Contracting Officer, and provide all additional information required by the Contracting Officer no later than 4:30pm, fifteen (15) calendar days prior to the bid opening date. For each product, one form shall be completed and submitted (i.e. 3 products should have 3 separate forms completed). The form is available on the SPO webpage at http://spo.hawaii.gov/ search for "Forms" and select form SPO-38.

Late submittals for this project will not be reviewed by the Department.

Change in Availability of Hawaii Product

In the event of any change that materially alters the offeror's ability to supply Hawaii Products, the offeror shall immediately notify the Contracting Officer in writing and the parties shall enter into discussions for the purposes of revising the contract or terminating the contract for convenience.

Offerors shall indicate in the Hawaii Product Schedule below whether the pre-approved Hawaii Products are offered. Offerors offering a Hawaii Product shall fill-in the quantity, unit measure, unit price and total price for the Hawaii Product they desire to be considered for preference. Products not pre-approved shall not be considered. Hawaii Products not meeting the requirements of the specification shall not be considered.

Offerors selecting the Hawaii Product preference may be required to submit additional information on the cost basis of their selected Hawaii Product preference items when requested after the bid opening to verify cost of the Hawaii Products, including the computations for the estimated quantities, manufacturer's or supplier's quotations, and delivered material cost Free on Board (FOB) at the jobsite. APPRENTICESHIP AGREEMENT PREFERENCE

The estimated value of the public works contract is \$250,000 or more and the apprenticeship agreement preference pursuant to Hawaii Revised Statutes §103-55.6 (Act 17, SLH 2009) **shall apply**.

- 1. If applicable to this project, any bidder seeking the preference must be a party to an apprenticeship agreement registered with the State Department of Labor and Industrial Relations (DLIR) at the time the bid is submitted for each apprenticeable trade the bidder will employ to construct the project. "Employ" means the employment of a person in an employer-employee relationship.
 - a. The apprenticeship agreement shall be registered with the DLIR and conform to the requirements of Hawaii Revised Statutes Chapter 372.
 - b. Subcontractors do not have to be a party to an apprenticeship agreement for the bidder to obtain the preference.
 - c. The bidder is not required to have apprentices in its employ at the time the bid is submitted to qualify for the preference.
- 2. A bidder seeking the preference must state the apprenticeable trade the bidder will employ for each trade to be employed to perform the work by submitting a completed <u>signed original</u> Certification of Bidder's Participation Form 1 verifying participation in an apprenticeship program registered with the DLIR. "Apprenticeable trade" shall have the same meaning as "apprenticeable occupation" pursuant to Hawaii Administrative Rules (HAR) §12-30-5.
 - a. The *Certification of Bidder's Participation Form 1 s*hall be authorized by an apprenticeship sponsor listed on the DLIR list of registered apprenticeship

- programs. "Sponsor" means an operator of an apprenticeship program and in whose name the program is approved and registered with the DLIR pursuant to HAR §12-30-1.
- b. The authorization shall be an original signature by an authorized official of the apprenticeship sponsor.
- c. The completed Certification of Bidder's Participation Form 1 for each trade must be submitted with the bid. A facsimile or copy is acceptable to be submitted with the bid, however the signed original must be submitted within five (5) working days of the bid open date. If the signed original is not received within this timeframe, the preference may be denied. Previous certifications shall not apply.
- d. When filling out the *Certification of Bidder's Participation Form 1*, the name of Apprenticeable Trade and Apprenticeship Sponsor must be the same as recorded in the List of Construction Trades in Registered Apprenticeship Programs that is posted on the State Department of Labor and Industrial Relations website. "Registered apprenticeship program" means a construction trade program approved by and registered with the DLIR pursuant to HAR § 12-30-1 and §12-30-4.
- e. The Certification of Bidder's Participation Form 1 and the List of Construction Trades in Registered Apprenticeship Programs is available on the DLIR website at: http://hawaii.gov/labor/wdd
- 3. Upon receiving the *Certification of Bidder's participation Form 1*, the Procurement Officer will verify that the apprenticeship program is on the List of Construction Trades in Registered Apprenticeship Programs and that the form is signed by an authorized official of the Apprenticeship Program Sponsor. If the programs and signature are not confirmed by the DLIR, the bidder will not qualify for the preference.
- 4. If the bidder is certified to participate in an apprenticeship program for each trade which will be employed by the bidder for the project, a preference will be applied to decrease the bidder's bid amount by five (5) percent for evaluation purposes.
- 5. Should the bidder qualify for other preferences (for example, Hawaii Products), all applicable preference shall be applied to the bid price.
- 6. If the winning bidder has submitted Form 1 with his bid packet, the Form 2 will be required the first week of each month for the prior month beginning with the month of the start of work.

CHARACTER OF WORKERS OR EQUIPMENT

The Contractor shall perform with his own organization, work amounting to not less than twenty percent (20%) of the total contract cost. The Engineer may require the Contractor to verify the percentage of work he will be providing with his own organization by furnishing pertinent information such as all of the actual subcontractor(s)' quotations he received for the bid. If requested, the Contractor shall provide such verification within 5 working days of the request.

CERTIFICATION FOR SAFETY AND HEALTH PROGRAM FOR BIDS IN EXCESS OF \$100,000

In accordance with HRS 396-18, by submitting this proposal, the undersigned certifies that his company will have a written safety and health plan for this project that will be available and implemented by the Notice to Proceed date of this project. Details of the requirements of this plan may be obtained from the Department of Labor and Industrial Relations, Occupational Safety and Health Division (HIOSH).

TAX CLEARANCES FROM THE STATE DIRECTOR OF TAXATION AND INTERNAL REVENUE SERVICE

Contractors are required to provide a state and federal tax clearance as a prerequisite to entering into a public contract of \$2,500 or more. To meet this requirement, all bidders shall submit valid tax clearances with their bid proposals when the bid is \$2,500 or more.

Failure to submit the required tax clearance may be sufficient grounds for the State to refuse to receive or consider the prospective bidder's proposal.
