Most of her career was spent in higher education in the University of Hawaii'i system where she was the Academic Advisor and then Lecturer at Kamakakūokalani Center for Hawaiian Studies and an Instructor of Hawaiian Studies at Windward Community College. Mehana has held several Executive roles at various Native Hawaiian Organizations like the Office of Hawaiian Affairs as the Director of Community Engagement and Advisor to the CEO and in her current role as Senior Advisor to the CEO at the Council for Native Hawaiian Advancement. Mehana currently oversees, Lahaina Wildfire Recovery efforts as Cultural Advisor to the Army Corps of Engineers, Cultural Sensitivity trainings for businesses and the U.S. Military, and Youth Civic Engagement, 'Aha 'Opio. Mehana brings a breadth and depth of relationships with Native Hawaiian communities, leaders, schools and businesses both locally and internationally.
