1. Business.

- The Army & Air Force Exchange Service's (AAFES) "We'll Match It!" initiative has been updated to allow authorized shoppers to compare prices between the exchange and "warehouse clubs." "We'll Match It!" works in two ways: (1) shoppers who see a price differential of less than \$10 can tell the cashier who will match it on the spot; (2) customers who report a price difference of greater than \$10 need only to bring a current local competitor's ad to receive the reduced price. The merchandise being compared must be identical. The "We'll Match It!" policy applies to all AAFES retail stores including main stores, Shoppettes, Class Six, Car Care and troop stores. - Xerox has set up a website where you can send a free Thank you card to military men and women serving in Iraq. There are several "canned" comments or you can write your own. - The Department of Defense is back to **anthrax immunizations**. A new policy memo recently requiring the DOD begin mandatory anthrax vaccinations for individuals remaining in the high-threat areas (primarily CENTCOM AOR or the Korean Peninsula) for 15 or more consecutive days. Additionally, personnel in designated special mission units, regardless of location, are also subject to mandatory Anthrax vaccinations.
- Air Force Uniform Updates. Air Force officials are moving forward with the Airman Battle Uniform rollout. The new ABU, designed to eventually replace both the Battle Dress and Desert Combat Uniforms worn by Airmen, is currently in full production. The ABUs are not the ugly blue shaded ones previously seen in news articles. The ABUs will be very similar to the ones the Army is transitioning to right now. ABUs will start making their appearance later this year starting with deployers and new Airmen at Basic Training. (Why we don't have ONE combat uniform for all services escapes me for some reason!) The Air Force is also moving forward with plans for a new service dress uniform more to come on that one. (One of my Army friends once said the Air Force seems to change uniforms every time the AF Chief of Staff changes.)
- Meanwhile... the Army is eliminating uniforms. Both the Army's Class A (service dress equivalent) and Class B (short sleeve shirt equivalent) uniforms are being retired. After the transition period, soldiers will have two uniforms: ACUs Army Combat Uniforms and their "Blues" The service dress uniform that looks like a cavalry uniform. Green versus Blue blue makes since because in the Revolutionary War, the British wore red and the Continental Army wore blue uniforms.
