- 154th Wing Operational Readiness Inspection. In the last issue, the public affairs news release described the overall Excellent the wing received. Many of you asked about the subratings. These ratings were:
- Initial Response Excellent
- Employment Excellent
- Mission Support Satisfactory
- Ability to Survive and Operate Excellent

While it was the first joint Air Force/Air National Guard inspection for the 154th Wing and the 15th Airlift Wing, the wings were graded separately. The 15th Airlift Wing received an overall Excellent.

Of particular significance are the inspectors' comments about the Wing's "strong sense of urgency and teamwork." It was another impressive showing by 154th Wing.

Since launching August 5, 2008, Afterdeployment.org has grown to provide more information and resources for service members returning from deployment – as well as for their families. "It's a free resource that can be very helpful for veterans transitioning back from their deployment," said Army Maj. Gen. Elder Granger, deputy director for TRICARE Management Activity.

The site provides change strategies and educational materials that address combat stress and triggers; conflict at work; re-connecting with family and friends; depression; anger; sleep problems; substance abuse; stress management; kids and deployment; spiritual guidance; living with physical injuries; and health and wellness.

with Deployment," "Seeking Spiritual Fitness," and "Controlling Drugs and Alcohol" sections of the Web site.

The diversity of registered users on Afterdeployment.org is a testimony to how wonderful the site is. Users report very positive feelings about the usefulness and quality of information available on Afterdeployment.org," said Granger. "We've received great feedback, and we expect the Web site to offer even more assistance to families and veterans," Granger added. "Statistics indicate that there is a balance of families, providers, veterans, and active duty service members registered on the site."

- Thrift Savings Plan (TSP) News Update March 2, 2009. Sandy Hashimoto of the Human Resources Office forwarded the following information for distribution to Retiree News readers.
- Required withdrawals. If you are age 70½ or older and you separated from Federal service on or before December 31, 2008, the TSP requires you to begin withdrawing your TSP account by April 1, 2009. Otherwise, your account may be subject to abandonment. The Internal Revenue Service also requires you to take your first required minimum distribution by April 1. If you have not yet made a withdrawal, the TSP will send you a check by mid-March to ensure that you satisfy your 2008 required distribution
- No required minimum distributions for 2009. For 2009 only, new tax law suspends required minimum distributions for separated participants age 70½ or older. However, the TSP deadline for withdrawing your TSP account when you are in this category is still in effect. If this affects you, you should have received an explanatory letter <a href="http://www.tsp.gov/curinfo/login/pension-bill-rmd\_ltr.pdf">http://www.tsp.gov/curinfo/login/pension-bill-rmd\_ltr.pdf</a>> from the TSP.

- IRS Form 1099-R. In January, the TSP mailed IRS Form 1099-R to participants who received withdrawals or other taxable distributions during 2008. These forms are also available online. If you have not received your mailed form, you can print out a copy from Account Access <<a href="http://www.tsp.gov/account/index.html">http://www.tsp.gov/account/index.html</a> or you can call the ThriftLine toll free at 1-TSP-YOU-FRST (1-877-968-3778) and press option 3 to speak to a participant service representative. Callers outside the United States and Canada should use 404-233-4400 (not toll free).
- Annual TSP participant statements. Last month, the TSP mailed annual statements to participants. We also posted them on this web site. Your annual statement summarizes the financial activity in your account during 2008. Check this statement carefully, and if you see any information you believe is not correct, follow up and see that it is changed. See Questions and Answers <a href="http://www.tsp.gov/faq/faq16-annual-stmt.html">http://www.tsp.gov/faq/faq16-annual-stmt.html</a> on this topic for more information.
- TSP is tax-deferred. When you prepare your 2008 tax return, remember that your taxable wages reported on your W-2 form will be different from your annual salary. Your contributions to the TSP are tax-deferred (or may, for some members of the uniformed services, be tax-exempt) and are not considered part of your income for Federal income tax purposes. Paying less tax on your current income is just one of the benefits of the TSP.
- Tax credit. If you participated in the TSP during tax year 2008, you may be eligible for the Retirement Savings Contributions Credit (formerly known as the Saver's Tax Credit), which is available to participants with a 2008 adjusted gross income of no more than \$53,000 if married filing jointly, \$39,750 if head of household, or \$26,500 if single or married filing separately. For information, consult your tax advisor or refer to IRS Form 8880.

- Turning military training into college credit. The following article was taken from a Military Times article written by Karen Jowers.

The American Council on Education has published a 51-page transfer guide to help service members and veterans understand transcripts and how their military training is translated into college credit.

ACE officials say they often hear from service members who are frustrated that the amount of college credit they receive for their military training falls short of their expectations. "We are hopeful this guide will provide information to these men and women who serve our nation so they receive credit, when appropriate, for their military education and training," said Jim Selbe, ACE assistant vice president for lifelong learning and a 20-year Marine Corps veteran. Eight service members from the various branches provided input to the guide, helping ACE officials improve the final version.

"A Transfer Guide: Understanding your Military Transcript and ACE Credit Recommendations" includes guidance, definitions of common terms, answers to frequently asked questions, and a transfer credit checklist. It includes information about factors that can affect the transfer of credit and transfer application deadlines, and how to appeal transfer decisions.

It provides details on how to get transcripts from each of the service branches, as well as other links and information about education resources in the military. The transfer guide encourages service members to research which academic institutions meet their needs, to understand the institution's transfer policies and procedures, and to start the transcript review process early.

For more than 50 years, another ACE publication, the Guide to the Evaluation of Educational Experience in the Armed Forces, has served as a detailed reference work that helps colleges and universities translate and recognize learning acquired in the military. That guide is now online, and the new transfer guide discusses the importance of that reference for service members and veterans.

The 91-year-old ACE represents more than 1,600 college and university presidents and more than 200 related associations, seeking to "provide leadership and a unifying voice on key higher education issues and influence public policy through advocacy, research and program initiatives."
