• No need for better reserve pay, GAO says. The following July 8, 2009 article was taken from the Military Times website.

A new congressional report says the Aug. 1 launch of the Post-9/11 GI Bill could be a good reason not to push for additional pay and benefits increases for National Guard and reserve members.

The Post-9/11 GI Bill, with its promise of paying full tuition plus a book allowance and living stipend, is not aimed specifically at the reserve components, but rather at people who have served extended periods on active duty since Sept. 10, 2001. That includes Guard and reserve members mobilized since the 2001 terrorist attacks who served 90 days or longer on active duty, but excludes those who were not activated or were activated for shorter periods.

In a report released Tuesday, the Government Accountability Office, the investigative arm of Congress, estimates that \$12.3 billion of the \$78.1 billion cost between now and 2018 for the new education benefits program will be spent on benefits for reservists or for transferred benefits for reservists' family members.

The GAO says that expense, coupled with a rise since 2001 in total compensation for National Guard and reserve members, is reason to put the brakes on proposals for other reserve benefits increases, including a decades-old effort to improve Montgomery GI Bill education benefits that eroded in comparison with active-duty benefits long before the new Post-9/11 GI Bill was even discussed.

Military and veterans groups have been pushing Congress to restore the value of the Montgomery GI Bill for drilling reservists by resetting reserve benefits to equal 47 percent of active-duty benefits. That would push the current \$329 maximum payment for fulltime reserve students to about \$621.

But Defense Department resistance to paying for the increases has blocked efforts to improve the reserve GI Bill.

Pay and benefits for reservists have been on the rise, the GAO says, estimating that total pay grew by 25 percent from fiscal 2001 to fiscal 2007, including cash, non-cash and deferred compensation. Cash benefits increased by about 24 percent, non-cash benefits such as health care and education grew by 21 percent and deferred compensation, which includes retired pay and retiree health care, grew by 28 percent.

Through December 23, 2009, each current or retired member of the U.S. military may obtain one complimentary 5-day "Disney's Armed Forces Salute" ticket with Park Hopper and Water Park Fun & More options. This ticket is valid for five days of admission into the four Walt Disney World theme parks, plus a total of five visits to a choice of a Disney water park, DisneyQuest Indoor Interactive Theme Park or certain other attractions.

During this offer period, current or retired U.S. military personnel (or their spouses, but not both) may purchase up to a maximum of five 5-Day "Disney's Armed Forces Salute Companion" tickets (one theme park per day) for \$99 per ticket, plus tax, for family members (including spouse) or friends. Although this ticket for family members and friends does not include either the Park Hopper or Water Park Fun & More options, this ticket can be upgraded to add either such option, or both, for an additional \$25, plus tax, per option. Actual prices may be less. All tickets and options are nontransferable and must be used by December 23, 2009.

"Disney's Armed Forces Salute" tickets can be obtained only at participating U.S. military base ticket offices (including at the Shades of Green Resort at the Walt Disney World Resort), or at main entrance theme park ticket windows. Tickets are not valid until activated at the main entrance theme park ticket windows. Valid military identification will be required to be presented by the service member (or spouse) for all ticket transactions (including activating tickets at the main entrance theme park ticket windows). All parties must be present when purchasing or activating tickets at main entrance theme park ticket windows.

• <u>Proper Care of the American Flag.</u> Many veterans and retirees display American flags at home. There is a protocol that goes with our American flag. The following is a short article by **Capt Joseph Ringer**, 15th Security Forces Squadron.

Few organizations and communities can match the depth of national pride seen on Hickam Air Force Base. This is especially true concerning display of the Stars and Stripes; and I'm not only referring to the base and numerous ceremonial flags, which dot the base's landscape, but also numerous smaller flags adorning the homes of the men and women who have sworn to protect and defend the ideals for which it stands. This tribute, while serving as a reminder of the promise of our great nation, as well as our own personal sacrifice, must be properly maintained so as not to diminish its intended patriotic effect.

Section 8j of the U.S. Flag Code states, "The flag represents a living country and is itself considered a living thing." As such, it requires care just as all "living things" do. So, here are a few tips that, if used regularly, will extend the life and appearance of your flag.

But before delving into flag care tips, I'd be remise if I didn't mention that proper display is paramount. Refer to the U.S. Flag Code at http://www.usflag.org/uscode36.html for a complete list of display customs and protocol. Now, back to the flag care list

- Use a flag marked "outdoor" for outdoor displays. Not all flags are created equal; ensure you display your flag as recommended by the manufacturer
- Choose the right size. Flags which fly from angled poles on homes are typically either three feet by five feet or four feet by six feet. Larger flags have specified flagpole height requirements. Keep in mind, the flag should never touch anything beneath it, such as the ground, the floor or water.
- Clean your flag. Outdoor flags may be hand-washed with a mild detergent, while indoor flags generally require dry-cleaning. Again, follow the manufacturer's recommendations.
- Take down your flag on high-wind days. High winds are extremely tough on flags and repeated exposure will eventually result in fly ends.

- Trim fly ends at the first sign of fraying. Flags may be trimmed as long as the overall dimensions are not noticeably altered.
- Don't forget the flagpole. Remove rust and scale, which can cause permanent stains and destroy the fabric.

The average life expectancy of an outdoor flag is three to six months. After six months, even with proper care, noticeable fading will have likely occurred. This is especially true here in Hawaii. When your flag is in such a condition that it is no longer a fitting emblem for display, it should be destroyed in a dignified manner. Many Veteran and civic organizations will properly dispose of your flag at no cost to you.

Remember, proper care of your flag will not only extend its life but also enhance the intended patriotic effect. Long may it wave...with proper care that is!
