- <u>Obama: Health Care Reform Won't Impact VA, Tricare</u>. The American Forces Press Service , written by Donna Miles, released the following article.

WASHINGTON, Aug. 4, 2009 - In ongoing discussions about health-care reform, President Barack Obama offered assurance today to those receiving medical care through Tricare or the Department of Veterans Affairs: Your benefits are safe. Eligibility for health care under VA or Tricare "will not be affected by our efforts at broader health-care reform," Obama told military reporters at the White House today. Obama said he also made that point clear after today's meeting with the American Legion's national commander, Dave Rehbein, and executive director, Peter Gaytan. "I want to make sure that message gets out to our veterans," the president said. "I think it's very important to get the message out: If you are in the VA system and are happy with your care, great. We have no intention of changing your eligibility."

While a new, national program won't force anyone to change health-care systems, Obama said it could offer benefits or geographic convenience that might make some veterans elect to join it. A national program "will actually give them more choices, more flexibility," he said. Obama cited problems in U.S. health-care delivery systems, which he said cost more than other countries' programs and too often deliver less. The VA "has probably made more progress than most systems out there in increasing quality" during the past 25 years, and could help shed light on better ways of delivering health care, he said.

But the cost of delivering that care is high even at VA, and Tricare consumes a big piece of the Defense Department's budget, he said. With the fiscal 2010 budget reflecting the largest VA funding increase in 30 years, Obama told American Legion leaders he is committed to ensuring that VA provides America's veterans the highest-quality health care possible.

Meanwhile, he told reporters VA will increase its outreach to more veterans to make sure they're aware of their medical benefits and other entitlements.

"Although there are hundreds of thousands of veterans who are using our services, we know there are hundreds of thousands more who may not know that benefits are available," he said. "And we are working really hard to make sure that every single veteran - not just our active force, but also National Guard and reservists, are aware of the benefits that are available to them.

"Guiding them through that process, we think, is extraordinarily important."

• TRICARE Managed Care Support Services Contract Award for the TRICARE West Region. TriWest Healthcare Alliance Corp, Phoenix, Arizona, has been selected to provide Managed Care Support (MCS) to the Department of Defense (DoD) TRICARE program in the West Region. The MCS contractor will assist the Military Health System in operating an integrated health care delivery system combining the resources of the contractor and the military's direct medical care system to provide health, medical and administrative support services to eligible beneficiaries in the West Region.

The West Region includes the states of Alaska, Arizona, California, Colorado, Hawaii, Idaho, Iowa (except the Rock Island Arsenal area), Kansas, Minnesota, Missouri (except the St. Louis area), Montana, Nebraska, Nevada, New Mexico, North Dakota, Oregon, South Dakota, Texas (areas of Western Texas only), Utah, Washington, and Wyoming.

Eligible beneficiaries include all active and retired members of the Uniformed Services, their spouses and children and their surviving family members, and former members of the Armed Forces who are Medal of Honor recipients and their immediate dependents.

Contract # H94002-09-C-0010 will be a cost-plus-fixed-fee type contract with a 10-month base period (transition-in) and five (5) one-year option periods for health care delivery, plus a transition-out period. The total potential contract value, including all option periods is estimated at \$16,956,510,153. The instant award, which comprises the base period (transition-in) and option period 1, is valued at \$2,853,810,863.

This contract was competitively procured via the TRICARE Management Activity e-solicitation Web site with two (2) offers received. The TRICARE Management Activity, Aurora, Colorado, is the contracting activity.

- TRICARE Obtains Lower Prices on Retail Prescription Drugs. The following article is off the TRICARE website.

FALLS CHURCH, Va. – The Defense Department is projected to reduce spending by \$1.67 billion on prescription medications sold in retail pharmacies in fiscal year 2010, following the full

implementation of Section 703 of the National Defense Authorization Act (NDAA) for fiscal year 2008.

"These are significant savings to the Department of Defense and are crucial to our effort to slow the rapid growth of pharmacy costs," said Rear Adm. Thomas McGinnis, chief of TRICARE pharmaceutical operations.

For the past several years the Department of Defense (DoD) has paid commercial rates for prescription drugs purchased in the TRICARE retail pharmacy network. However, DoD is included in the 1992 Veteran's Healthcare Act as one of the "big four" government agencies entitled to federal prices when it purchases pharmaceuticals for its beneficiaries.

DoD currently receives federal ceiling prices, the maximum price that can be charged for brand name drugs, in military treatment facilities and the TRICARE Mail Order Pharmacy. Through authority provided in Section 703 of the 2008 NDAA and the "final rule" implementing the regulation, DoD will now get these same discounts in the TRICARE retail pharmacy network. The final rule was effective May 26, 2009.

Controlling the growth in pharmacy benefit costs for both the beneficiaries and the government is an ongoing process for TRICARE. Beneficiaries can sign up to get e-alerts for updates to their pharmacy benefit through the "email Updates" link on the front page of <a href="http://www.tricare.mil">http://www.tricare.mil</a>.

• <u>Hawaii Air Guard gives Pacific Angel a lift</u>. The following article was written by TSgt Cohen A. Young of the Defense Media Activity-Hawaii.

July 20, 2009 – Kupang, Indonesia --More than 80 U.S. Air Force active duty, Air National Guard and reserve medical and engineering personnel are providing humanitarian assistance with local authorities in Indonesia and Timor Leste, all thanks to a "lift" by the Hawaii Air National Guard. A C-17 Globemaster III aircrew from the HIANG's 24<sup>th</sup> Airlift Squadron at Hickam Air Force Base, Hawaii, dropped off the Operation Pacific Angel 2009 team here July 15, 2009.

Pacific Angel is a Pacific Air Forces humanitarian assistance operation in the Asia-Pacific region led by 13<sup>th</sup> Air Force at Hickam AFB. Two Pacific Angel teams are operating through July 24 - one here and another in Timor Leste. "I like this mission because we have a humanitarian [operation], and we are carrying doctors and nurses," said 14-year Guardsman and lead loadmaster MSgt Joseph Salvador, a native of Oahu, Hawaii.

The C-17 crew dropped off two groups to support Pacific Angel. One group remained in Kupang while the other group moved on to Dili, Timor Leste. The second group was transported to Dili by way of a C-130 Hercules aircrew from the 176<sup>th</sup> Wing at Kulis Air National Guard Base, Alaska.

"It's cool that we get to help support this group that is going to provide humanitarian relief," said six-year loadmaster TSgt Kimberly Kido of Oahu, Hawaii.

• <u>Air Force to hire civilians to manage unit programs</u>. Remember all those additional duties to cover the various support programs. Well the Air Force has come up with their solution. The Air Force News Service article does not mention if the program extends to the Guard and Reserve.

July 21, 2009 - RANDOLPH AIR FORCE BASE, Texas -- Squadrons with more than 50 military and civilian members could start seeing relief in managing their additional duties as early as this fall, with a 1,200 newly created civilian unit program coordinator positions.

Feedback from the 2008 Airman's Time Assessment revealed Airmen were being pulled away from their primary duty stations to work full time on unit programs such as the Government Travel Card program, safety program, automated data processing equipment accounts and security programs. "We found that when the commander's support staffs drew down, commanders were left with two options. They could either manage these tactical administrative programs themselves or pull Airmen from the frontlines to do it," said Maj. Christopher Busque of Force Support Officer Career Field Management in the Pentagon. "We were concerned that the resulting effect was causing a loss of mission capability." By hiring 1,200 civilian UPCs, Air Force officials will effectively put Airmen back into their primary duties, preserving Airmen's time and maximizing administrative efficiency across the Air Force, Major Busque said.

Announcements of the GS-06, GS-07 and YB-1 job vacancies are projected to hit USAJobs and the Air Force's secure employment site this month, with new hires reporting to work as early as October.

Ideal candidates for the positions should:

- Possess strong administrative or personnel background
- Ability to manage and organize multiple tasks
- Be customer oriented
- Understand personnel tracking.

"These incoming civilian Airmen are going to be great assets to the squadrons because not only will they help keep our talented, healthy, motivated and well-equipped Airmen working on the primary mission, the unit program coordinators will have the most current knowledge on evolving programs and will provide continuity in a very fluid environment," said Paula Blackwell from the Directorate for Civilian Force Integration at the Air Force Personnel Center here.

Ms. Blackwell cautioned that UPCs should not be confused with administrative assistants. The primary purpose of the UPC is to manage unit programs and serve as unit liaisons to the military and civilian personnel offices.

Commanders looking to hire for these positions should contact their force support squadron/mission support squadron commander. Individuals interested in applying should

search USAJobs or the Air Force's secure employment site for "Unit Program Coordinator, GS-0303, YB-0303" for specific locations.
