- <u>Yellow Ribbon Program Provides Support Services</u>. The following DoD press release reports on the new DoD Yellow Ribbon Program.

WASHINGTON, Aug. 17, 2009 - The Yellow Ribbon Program is "off and running," said the program's deputy executive director, James "Scotty" Scott. The program's goal is to prepare servicemembers and their families for mobilization, sustain families during mobilization, and reintegrate soldiers with their families, communities and employers upon redeployment.

During the first nine months of fiscal 2009, reserve components have hosted more than 1,367 Yellow Ribbon events across the 54 U.S. states and territories. Through these events, more than 133,000 reservists and their family members have received valuable training and information about support services available to them before, during and after mobilization.

In addition to helping families understand their benefits and entitlements as they transition in and out of active-duty status, the program also links people to services such as referrals and counseling through Military OneSource, Veterans Affairs Vet Centers, TRICARE, and other state and local programs.

Ultimately, deployment support and military family programs are the responsibility of each unit commander. However, the program assists commanders by actively surveying the best practices from the military services, and combining those to form a joint program that servicemembers and their families can rely on for assistance and support regardless of service, component or location.

"The Yellow Ribbon Program represents an increasingly valuable resource that commanders are able to integrate into their overall deployment support, readiness and support program," said Dennis M. McCarthy, the assistant secretary of defense for Reserve Affairs.

Meanwhile, the newly formed Yellow Ribbon Advisory Board has conducted its second meeting in the Pentagon. In addition to Defense Department representatives, leaders from the reserve components and the Departments of Labor and Veterans Affairs were in attendance.

The advisory board's mission is to provide independent advice regarding the program to the undersecretary of defense for personnel and readiness. Along with recommending improvements for delivery of services, the board is required to submit a report to the Senate and House Armed Services committees at least once a year. The board is completing its initial report to Congress, which is due in early September. It also is in the process of finalizing a department instruction, which will provide Yellow Ribbon guidance to the individual reserve components.

• <u>Pacific Air Forces Change of Command</u>. The Pacific Air Forces Change of Command has happened on Wednesday, August 18, 2009. **General Gary L. North** assumed command from **General Howie Chandler** at the ceremony on the Freedom Tower Mall on Hickam AFB. **General Norton A. Schwartz**, Air Force Chief of Staff, and Navy **Admiral Thomas J. Keating**, U.S. Pacific Command commander officiated.

General North is coming from command of 9th Air Force and U.S. Air Forces Central, headquartered at Shaw AFB, South Carolina. The general has led air operations in Iraq and Afghanistan since early 2006. After just less than two years in the job, General Chandler is returning to the Pentagon in Washington DC where he'll be the Vice Chief of Staff of the Air Force, the service's second highest post.

- Change in Non-Prior Service Enlistment Age. Change 1 to ANGI 36-2002, Enlistment and Reenlistment in the Air National Guard and as a Reserve of the Air Force, has raised the maximum enlisted age for non-prior service individuals to age 40. The change became effective on August 11, 2009. This change will provide Air Guard opportunities to older individuals who are interested in enlisting it the Air National Guard.
- <u>Joint Base Pearl Harbor-Hickam</u>. Pearl Harbor and Hickam AFB will merge starting later this year. This action is a result of the 2005 Base Realignment and Closure (BRAC) Commission. The Navy will serve as the lead.

There are many questions about joint basing. These two are the most commonly asked and are part of the Pearl Harbor-Hickam AFB joint basing website referenced below.

Q: Why is DoD going to a Joint Basing concept?

A: Modern warfare is joint warfare. In addition to saving scarce funds, this move to Joint Basing will allow us to build closer relationships and forge stronger ties between services. We will not only train as we fight, we will live as we fight. This is part of an ongoing effort to maintain the most efficient and effective force structure.

- When a retiree passes away, the surviving spouse, or children are often unsure about what they should do in regard to the military retiree's pay and benefits. A retiree should create a list of names and phone numbers that need to be contacted when he or she dies and inform the spouse and family members as to what is on the list and where to find it. This list should include the:
- DFAS, Retired and Annuity Pay Center 1-800-321-1080 to stop retired pay, apply for Survivor Benefits, and obtain information about insurance and other allotments
- Veterans Administration 1-800-827-1000 for Disability Pay and burial assistance and/or applying for Dependency Indemnity Compensation (DICE) for the surviving spouse
- Social Security Administration 1-800-772-1213 to discuss Social Security Survivor benefits
- Office of Personnel Management 1-888-767-6738 for retirees who are receiving civil service pensions in addition to military retired pay

MG Alexis Lum, 82, died over the August 30, 2009 weekend. General Lum served as the State Adjutant General from 1983 to 1991.

The general began his military career as an army draftee in 1945, serving in World War II, and later in both the Korean and Vietnam Wars. He was a 1950 graduate of the University of Hawaii, Manoa. He received his commission as an Army second lieutenant in through its ROTC program. In 1953, he joined the Hawai'i Army National Guard. He served in various command and staff positions. During the 29th Brigade's 1968 activation, he served in Vietnam as the executive office of the 31st Engineer Battalion. Following his Vietnam service, the general returned to Hawai'i and become the commander of the Headquarters Installation Command. In 1980, he became the Commander of the Hawai'i Army National Guard.

In civilian life, the general was a Federal employee from 1954 until he retired in 1982. He served his entire Federal career at the Naval Ammunition Depot, now known as the Lualualei Naval Magazine.

Governor George Ariyoshi appointed General Lum as the Adjutant General in 1983. After his tenure as the Adjutant General ended in 1991, he joined the staff of Senator Daniel Inouye as the senator's military liaison. He served until December 2007.

The general is survived by his wife the former Leimomi Mookini and they have three children, Angela, Alexia and Oliver. Funeral services are pending.
