• New TRICARE Standard Handbook – Get e-Version Now. TRICARE issued the following press release (10-11) on January 29, 2010. The release discusses and links you to the new handbook for TRICARE Standard beneficiaries.

Falls Church, Va. - Hot off the press and filled with helpful tips and information, the newest TRICARE Standard and Extra handbook is now available to all TRICARE Standard beneficiaries. The 68-page handbook includes information on accessing routine, urgent and emergency care, as well as TRICARE's prior authorization and referral requirements. Also provided are sections on what's covered by TRICARE Standard's health and pharmacy benefits, and how to coordinate TRICARE with other health insurance. Information on claims, appeals, grievances, reporting fraud and abuse and much more can also be found in the new TRICARE Standard handbook.

TRICARE Standard and Extra are available to family members of active duty service members, retired service members and their families and others including those who purchase TRICARE Reserve Select. With TRICARE Standard, beneficiaries manage their own health care and have the freedom to seek care from any TRICARE-authorized provider. TRICARE Extra provides discounted cost-shares for seeking care from network providers.

TRICARE Standard beneficiaries can expect to see the annual TRICARE Standard Health Matters newsletter, containing the latest updates and information about their benefits, in their mailbox in March 2010. Receiving the newsletters from TRICARE is one more reason to keep personal information current in the Defense Enrollment Eligibility Reporting System (DEERS). Along with address or phone number changes, both active duty and retired beneficiaries should

update their DEERS entry with any changes to their families (birth, adoption or death), changes in sponsor status, marriage, divorce, or when they become eligible for Medicare. For more information about DEERS visit www.tricare.mil/deers

- NGAUS Conference in Hawaii in 2013. Honolulu (AP) - Thousands of National Guardsmen and women plan to hold their annual convention in Hawaii in 2013. Hawaii National Guard commander **Maj. Gen. Robert G.F. Lee** said that the three-day meeting is expected to attract 5,000 people and generate \$24 million in visitor spending. The National Guard Association of the United States will gather at the Hawaii Convention Center next to Waikiki. Honolulu competed with Chicago to host the Sept. 21-23, 2013, event.

- How can I obtain copies of my military records? Individual military departments, including the Air Force do not maintain files or records pertaining to individuals no longer on active duty. When an individual is separated from military service (because of retirement, discharge from active duty, or death), his/her Field Personnel File (containing all military and health records) is forwarded for storage to the National Personnel Records Center (Military). The Records Center is under the jurisdiction of the National Archives and Records Administration (NARA) of the United States Government.

An individual's complete service record is available to the former service member or, if deceased, to his/her next of kin (parents, spouse, or children). Limited information (such as dates of service, awards, and training) is available to anyone. Not available to the general public is information which would invade an individual's privacy; for example, medical records, Social Security number, or present address.

When requesting the records of a relative, the requester should mention the relationship to the former member - brother, uncle, or other. There is no charge for this service to former service members or their next of kin. For others, a nominal fee is charged for research and reproduction costs. Files at the Records Center are maintained as historical records only and are not updated to reflect current data on the former service member. Creating an account is easy and secure. After entering their e-mail address at [www.tricare.mil/subscriptions](#), beneficiaries can choose their beneficiary category and topics that appeal to them. After that they'll receive the latest TRICARE news releases, benefit changes, podcasts, healthy lifestyle tips and pharmacy updates from TRICARE Communications.

The subscription service also allows users to subscribe to other Military Health System Web sites and other health-related federal Web sites. Some of the Web sites currently available include those from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and Food and Drug Administration.

- MG Taluto Withdraws from Army Guard Nomination Retires. **MG Joseph Taluto**, who in 2005 became the first Army National Guard officer to command a division in combat since the Korean War, has withdrawn his nomination to become director of the Army Guard and will retire. President Obama nominated Taluto, the New York adjutant general, in May. Senate approval was delayed when the widow of one of two U.S. soldiers killed in Iraq blamed Taluto for not doing more to prevent the deaths. The charge was never substantiated. A fellow soldier was charged with the killings, but was acquitted in a court-martial.

Taluto said in a prepared statement Thursday that he pulled his name because the prolonged confirmation process had become a distraction. "While I appreciate all the urging and support I have had to stay the course, this is a crucial time for our National Guard," he said. "I feel that withdrawing is the right thing to do because the Army National Guard needs a director as soon as possible."

Maj Gen Tod Bunting, NGAUS chairman of the board (and the Adjutant General of Kansas), called Taluto's action "a dignified ending to a sad process." "General Taluto is a good man who would've been a great director of the Army National Guard," he said. Taluto would have succeeded Lt. Gen. Clyde Vaughn, who retired in June. The duties have been handled by **MG Ray Carpenter**, who is functioning in an interim or "acting" capacity. "We hope everyone will move quickly to fill this position," Bunting added. "General Carpenter has been doing an outstanding job in difficult circumstances, but the Army National Guard truly needs a permanent director as soon as possible."

MG Taluto commanded the 42nd Infantry Division from 2002 to 2006, when he became the head of the New York National Guard.

- TriWest Offers New Service. TriWest Healthcare Alliance is offering a new lung health service to West Region TRICARE beneficiaries eligible for its Disease Management programs. Beneficiaries suffering from chronic obstructive pulmonary disease, or COPD, can receive extra help for a group of lung diseases that include emphysema, chronic bronchitis and, in some cases, asthma. Eligibility is determined by TRICARE and is based on claims history. Once a beneficiary is identified as eligible to participate in the program, DOD refers the beneficiary to TriWest. WASHINGTON - **Gervin Miyamoto**, a 38-year veteran of county, state and federal law enforcement agencies has been nominated by President Barack Obama to serve as the next U.S. Marshal for the District of Hawaii, Senators Daniel K. Inouye and Daniel K. Akaka announced today.

Miyamoto, an Aiea resident, will be the 19th U.S. Marshal responsible for Hawaii and replaces Mark M. “Dutch” Hanohano.

Miyamoto is a 25-year veteran of the Honolulu Police Department (HPD) where he served in variety of capacities including as a member of the Narcotics/Vice division, Specialized Services Division, Criminal Intelligence Unit and as a special assistant to the late Police Chief Michael Nakamura.

After retiring from HPD in 1995, Miyamoto spent four years as the State Counterdrug Coordinator before taking a job in 1999 with the Department of Justice as Law Enforcement Coordinator under then U.S. Attorney Edward H. Kubo Jr.

Miyamoto also served in the Hawaii Army National Guard as the 154th Security Police Squadron Commander.

“Gervin has dedicated much of his life to law enforcement and is well qualified to serve as U.S. Marshal for Hawaii,” said Senator Inouye. “His diversified experiences at the county, state and federal level will serve him well as he continues to help ensure the safety of our residents and visitors. The general returned to Hawaii in 1991 as the plans officer for the new 203rd Air Refueling Squadron. After working in several positions in the unit, he served as the squadron commander from 1995 to 2000. In 2000, he became the commander of the 154th Mission Support Group. In 2004, he became the Vice Commander of the 154th Wing.

In July 2004, the general returned to Washington to become the A1, Director of Manpower and Personnel for the Air National Guard. He returned to Hawaii in 2006 to become the Assistant Adjutant General - Air, before assuming his current position in 2007.
