- **TRICARE Benefits Outlined.** If you go to the TRICARE My Benefit website, and answer a few simple questions, the site take you to the exact TRICARE benefits you are entitled. This website was shown the greatest improvement than any of the 103 Federal websites tracked by the American E-Government Satisfaction Index.

March 12, 2010 - FALLS CHURCH, Va. – Since the American E-Government Satisfaction Index began measuring Web surfers' opinions in 2003 about the sites they visit, none of the 103 federal government Web sites it tracks has shown greater improvement in customer satisfaction than TRICARE's.

The steady increase in satisfaction with the TRICARE Beneficiary Web site is the result of TRICARE's constant and continuing commitment to improving beneficiaries' online experience. Throughout 2008, user satisfaction – measured by customer feedback – was higher than that same month in 2007. The 2007 redesign of the beneficiary Web site is one of the main reasons for the rating increase.

"TRICARE is an excellent example of a Web site that recognized the need for citizen-centric improvement and leap-frogged ahead as a result of the guidance it got from listening," said Larry Freed, American Customer Satisfaction Index President and CEO. "Its leadership should be commended for being so responsive to the needs of such an important constituency."

The site has a cleaner, more user-friendly layout allowing beneficiaries to easily find the information and updates they need about their benefit. A key feature of the redesign is having users personalize the information they get about their TRICARE benefit by answering three questions about their location, beneficiary status and current TRICARE plan.

Two other features launched in the redesign – the Plan Wizard and Is It Covered? – also helped to increase tricare.mil's usability. The Plan Wizard eliminates the guesswork for new beneficiaries who may not be sure which TRICARE plan they are enrolled in and provides a list of plans they may be eligible for. Beneficiaries can visit the Is It Covered? section to find out which health care services TRICARE covers.

More improvements to tricare.mil are on the way including streamlined profile entry and a solutions center featuring answers to the most frequently asked questions about TRICARE.

- **TRICARE Newsletters Get the Word Out Electronically.** FALLS CHURCH, Va. – With a few clicks of a mouse, TRICARE beneficiaries can sign up at www.tricare.mil/subscriptions to have the latest TRICARE benefit news sent to them electronically. All of the newsletters and bulletins

TRICARE currently prints are available online and can be delivered electronically straight to an e-mail inbox.

TRICARE Health Matters is mailed to Prime beneficiaries seven times a year. Health Matters includes updates on recent changes to TRICARE Prime, articles about the latest health-related information and reminders about how and when to update Defense Enrollment Eligibility Reporting System (DEERS) information.

Each year TRICARE Standard beneficiaries receive their copy of TRICARE Standard Health Matters. Like its Prime counterpart, it includes the most up-to-date Standard benefit information and helpful articles about staying healthy. In September 2010, TRICARE is releasing a special edition of the Standard Newsletter available only in an electronic format.

The TRICARE Dental Health Matters newsletter is delivered to dental enrollee homes three times a year. Filled cover-to-cover with dental benefit updates and tips about keeping teeth healthy, TRICARE Dental Health Matters is dedicated to helping beneficiaries understand their dental coverage and receive the best dental care possible.

To get the Standard e-Newsletter and other TRICARE newsletters electronically or receive e-mail alerts, beneficiaries can subscribe by their region and beneficiary category – for example, active duty family member, retiree or National Guard or Reserve member – or select the specific health-related topics they want more information about.

Subscribing to TRICARE's electronic delivery system is fast and secure, just go to www.tricare.mil/subscriptions. An e-mail address is the only information collected and beneficiaries have a unique page where they can manage their subscriptions 24/7.

- Campaign Stars Approved for Latest OIF Phases. The following Military Times article, written by staff writer William McMichael, describes changes to the campaign start to the Iraqi Campaign Medal. It was published on Thursday March 11, 2010.

Bronze campaign stars recognizing the 2007-08 surge of American troops into Iraq, as well as current stabilization efforts, have been authorized for wear on the Iraq Campaign Medal, the Pentagon announced Thursday.

The surge campaign phase has been established as running from January 1, 2007, to December 31, 2008; the second campaign star, for the phase identified as "Iraqi Sovereignty," began January 1, 2009, and will continue through a date to be determined.

Although all who have served in "direct support" in the Iraq war on or after March 13, 2003, are authorized to wear the medal, the stars recognize designated campaigns during the war.

Four previous phases had been identified, and service members who have qualified for the Iraq Campaign Medal can display a bronze campaign star on their medal for each designated campaign phase in which they took part.

The other four phases, announced previously, are:

Liberation of Iraq: March 19, 2003, to May 1, 2003

Transition of Iraq: May 2, 2003, to June 28, 2004

Iraqi Governance: June 29, 2004, to December 15, 2005

The "National Resolution" phase: December 16, 2005, to January 9, 2007

The respective military departments are currently working specific implementation guidance.
