• **TRICARE and TriWest Healthcare Alliance.** The terms TriWest and TRICARE are often used interchangeably, but each is distinctly different. It is easy to see why people may be confused - the names of both start with the same three letters and both have similar logos.



Created in the early 1990s, TRICARE is the U.S. Department of Defense (DoD) health care entitlement for active duty, Guard and Reserve and retired members of the military, and their eligible family members and survivors. TRICARE's objectives are to optimize the delivery of health care services at military treatment facilities and supplement that with access to civilian health care networks where necessary. TRICARE receives its funding as part of the annual federal defense budget, which is approved by

Congress and signed by the President of the United States.

TriWest Healthcare Alliance is one of three national organizations who administers TRICARE for the Department of Defense. TriWest Healthcare Alliance is a privately held, Phoenix-based corporation that contracts with the DoD to administer TRICARE in the 21-state [TRICARE West Region](#). The TRICARE Management Authority, a department within the DoD, monitors TriWest Healthcare Alliance operations.

TRICARE is not an insurance plan, but rather a health care entitlement earned by our nation's military members for their service to this country. Likewise, TriWest is not an insurance company. TriWest is a contractor to the DoD that administers the TRICARE program in the 21-state West Region.

TriWest has a Guard and Reserve Resource Center (GRRC) for servicemembers and their families. Log on to [www.triwest.com/ngr](http://www.triwest.com/ngr). The website provides TRICARE tools, information and resources (including video briefings) when you need them.

Through TriWest online Care ([www.triwest.com/onlinecare](http://www.triwest.com/onlinecare)) chat online or talk over web video with a counselor about medical issues.

TriWest operates a Hawai'i office in Mapunapuna and Mr. Karl Kiyokawa is the Vice President for Hawai'i operations. Mr. Kiyokawa and the local TriWest office are super supporters of the military – active, Guard and Reserve. Besides doing a super job servicing TRICARE beneficiaries, they are always supporting military events like our annual National Guard Birthday Ball.

● TRICARE fee structure needs overhaul, says Defense official. The following article written by Kellie Linney, appeared on the Government Executive website on May 13, 2010. Unlike other benefit or entitlement programs, TRICARE costs come directly from the Department of Defense budget. As the Department's budget faces increased expenses, TRICARE becomes an area where raising fees paid by the beneficiaries could increase to offset the rising costs.

The Pentagon's top policy official on Thursday called for changes in the military's health benefits system for retirees, saying the current structure has become unsustainable in today's economic environment. "If there was an infinite pot of money, that would be fine; the problem is, there isn't an infinite pot of money, and so those dollars are dollars we can't invest in the equipment that our military needs today and the capabilities they need to adapt to the future," said Michèle Flournoy, Defense undersecretary for policy, during remarks at a leadership breakfast sponsored by *Government Executive* in Washington.

Many military retirees who now work in the private sector are forgoing the health benefits offered by their companies and opting instead for the TRICARE system, in part because employers are offering incentives for them to do so in an effort to keep down their own health

care costs. "We have the military carrying people who have a private sector alternative to health care because we've got the incentive structure wrong," Flournoy said.

A former Defense Department official during the Clinton administration, Flournoy tackled several topics during Thursday's discussion at the National Press Club, ranging from outsourcing to cybersecurity to military pay and benefits, including TRICARE, which she referred to as a "third rail" issue. Flournoy's remarks on TRICARE echoed recent comments from the [military's top brass](#) as well as those from Defense Secretary Robert Gates in a [May 8 speech](#) in Kansas. In that address, Gates outlined a multibillion-dollar [cost savings plan](#) for the department, which would include a reduction in administrative overhead, acquisition reform, greater energy efficiency, and an overhaul of TRICARE premiums and co-pays, especially for retirees.

"Leaving aside the sacred obligation we have to America's wounded warriors, health care costs are eating the Defense Department alive, rising from \$19 billion a decade ago to roughly \$50 billion -- roughly the entire foreign affairs and assistance budget of the [State Department](#)," Gates said. He noted that premiums for TRICARE have not risen since the program was founded more than a decade ago.

Also on Thursday, Flournoy did not rule out reducing the number of high-ranking officers in the military as a way to streamline the department, saying Gates "is going to want to understand the allocation of flag officers and why we have who we have, and are there positions that are truly necessary?" Flag officer positions are congressionally authorized, so the Pentagon would need the blessing of Congress to tweak the number of those slots.

Flournoy said there is no target head count with respect to the structure of the Pentagon's civilian, military or contractor workforce, but she also emphasized Gates' overall commitment to belt-tightening. "Secretary Gates is not shy about making hard decisions," she said. "He is not shy about holding leaders in the building accountable. I think all of his components, all of his direct reports, have been put on notice [that] we're going to start this review for efficiency with ourselves."

He is a command pilot with more than 4,200 hours in the C-141B, T-1A, KC-135R/T and C-40B. As the 15th Airlift Wing vice commander, Barrett assisted the wing commander in providing operations and support functions for worldwide missions and command leadership for the operation and maintenance of Hickam and Wake Island airfields. Army officials are urging all drivers who live on, work on, or frequently use Army installations to register their vehicles at an Army Vehicle Registration Office and to display an official military decal on their vehicles, by May 1, as part of an initiative to enhance installation security. Beginning May 1, drivers who do not have a current military decal (DD Form 2220) or Army

pass will be routed to the closest Visitor Control Center (VCC) for a temporary access pass. VCCs are located at Schofield Barracks' Lyman gate, Fort Shafter's Buckner gate, and Tripler Army Medical Center's main gate, and can provide passes ranging in length from one-day to one-week, based on need.

Most of our retirees accesses Army installations for recurring activities, such as doctor's appointments, grocery shopping, or the like. Taking those minutes to register and get a decal means not having to take more time later getting a temporary pass each time you want to come on post."
