## HELPFUL SPRINGS REMINDERS FOR OUR VETERANS (con't)

- ⇒ Test smoke alarms and carbon-monoxide detectors; moisture and salt air can wear down batteries faster.
- ⇒ Declutter gently - one small area per day - to avoid lifting heavy items or tripping hazards.
- ⇒ Check for loose rugs, cords, or slippery spots, especially if the floors get damp from island humidity.
- ⇒ Clean ceiling fans, window screens, and lanai areas to reduce dust and improve airflow during warmer months.
- ⇒ Consider donating gently used clothing, household goods, or tools to local organizations that support Veterans on Kauai.

We hope these simple reminders help make your home feel safe, comfortable, and full of aloha. And most importantly, please remember to take care of yourself - your health, your spirit, and your peace come first.



## HELPFUL SPRING REMINDERS FOR OUR VETERANS

To support you, we've prepared a few simple spring cleaning reminders tailored especially for our Kaua'i Veterans. These small steps can help keep your home safe, comfortable, and ready for the warmer months ahead.

- ⇒ Check your hurricane and emergency kits before hurricane season begins; replace water, batteries and flashlights as needed.
- ⇒ Review medications and safely dispose of expired ones; your local VA clinic or pharmacy can help with guidance.
- ⇒ Organize important documents (DD-214, VA health records, emergency contacts) and store them in a dry easy to reach place.
