Even 21st Transfers Free Dec. 15

WASHINGTON (UPI) — Members of the 29th Infantry Brigade who have been transferred to other organizations will still be released from active duty when the 29th is deactivated, Rep. Pat-
sy T. Mink said Tuesday.

Mrs. Mink said the volume of mail she receives indicates servicemen and their wives are still confused by the deactivation procedures. She said the Pentagon has assured her Reservists who serve in Vietnam "will be released from active duty after completion of the normal one year tour of duty in Vietnam, or Dec. 15, 1969, whichever is earlier."

"Those units mobilized in May (1968) who remain assigned within the United States for their entire tour will be released from active duty between 1 and 15 December, 1969," the Pentagon statement said.

"That clearly means that all the men who were called up with the 29th will be released from active duty by Dec. 15 at the latest, regardless of where they are stationed, whether or not they are still in the 29th Brigade or whether or not they have completed a one-year tour of duty in Vietnam," Mrs. Mink said.
