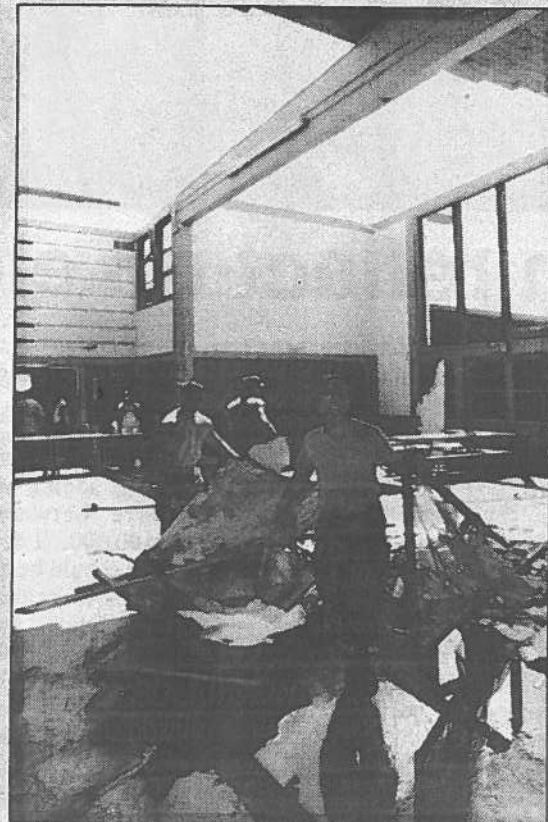

Kauai schools to open

LIHUE — Six Kauai public schools will reopen — at least partially — Tuesday.

District Superintendent Shirley Akita said Kekaha, Kaunualii, and Koloa Elementary School will have morning sessions for kindergarten and all six grades.

Wilcox Elementary will be open for kindergarten and first grade only, Elele Elementary will take only fifth and sixth-graders, and Kauai High and Intermediate will be open to seniors only.

Students are asked to wear covered shoes.

Meanwhile, about 3,000 Army, Marine Corps and Hawaii National Guard personnel will be sent to Kauai Tuesday to help clear the island of trash and garbage.

The troops will collect dead trees and branches, household trash and garbage and dispose of it according to state and county plans. State health officials had expressed concerns about a potential health hazard from rotting food and decaying plant life.

Kauai Electric said it is continuing to make progress in restoring power to the island. However, the island remains without electricity, and more than a third of all utility poles are still down.
