

## Demobilization Of 29th Brigade

Demobilization ceremonies for the 29th Infantry Brigade are scheduled for December 6, at 10 a.m. at Lightning Field, Schofield Barracks.

Taking part in the ceremonies will be more than 2,000 men of the various National Guard and Army Reserve units which comprise the 29th Brigade.

The 2d Battalion, 299th Infantry will be the color battalion for a mass color detachment.

The 264th Army Band, USARPAC, will furnish the music while an artillery salute battery from the 29th Brigade fires a 19-gun salute. (If Gov. Burns attends).
