Guard, Reserves To Service May 14

More than 4,000 of Hawaii's National Guardsmen and Army Reservists begin preparations for their callup May 13.

The Army National Guard's 29th Brigade and the Army Reserve's 100th Battalion, 442nd Infantry were announced as the Hawaii units to be part of a nationwide callup, of which 10,000 of 24,500 men will be sent to Vietnam.

U.S. Senator Daniel K. Inouye, who returned to Honolulu yesterday to attend the U.S.-Mexico Interparliamentary Conference, said he does not think the Hawaii

Guardsmen and Reservists will be sent to Vietnam.

The island Democrat said, "It is my understanding that the men called up in Hawaii will serve in this vicinity."

Meanwhile, University of Hawaii president Thomas Hamilton is seeking deferments until June 1 for university students affected by the callup.

Such deferments would enable the students to finish the current semester at the university.

Hamilton said if this proves impossible, he will urge the students affected by the callup to finish the semester's work by May 12, the day before they enter active duty.
