The governor said he does not anticipate that the troops will be sent to the mainland for duty.

Burns said he believes the Hawaii National Guard units will either remain in Hawaii or be sent to Vietnam.

But, he said, it will be a long time before the Hawaii National Guard goes anywhere.

Burns restated his determination that the Hawaii Guard troops will not go to the mainland.

Tuesday the Governor told a group of about 200 University of Hawaii students that he would resist any move to send the Hawaii National Guard to the Mainland to suppress racial disturbances.

The State Adjutant General, Maj. Gen. Benjamin Webster, said he has not received any word on where the guard might go but many observers feel they will stay in Hawaii.

The Hawaii National Guard numbers more than 3,000 men while the reservists total 841.
