Maui Losing Treasurer To the Army

WAILUKU — About 300 Maui County men are involved in the Federal mobilization of Hawaii's 29th Infantry Brigade, notably including the County Treasurer, Shigeto (Mustard) Murayama.

County Chairman Elmer F. Cravalho said Thursday the mobilization of that number from Maui "is going to create a considerable amount of disruption. Needless to say, we all regret the apparent necessity for these disruptions."

Regarding Murayama's call-up Cravalho said, "This administration is going to miss him. The treasurer has played a vital role in the development of our programs."

But he said Murayama's departure was not expected to create any legal problems, for example in the recently authorized issuance of \$2.9 million in County bonds. Cravalho said the deputy treasurer would be able to serve in Murayama's absence, including the requirement that bonds be signed by the County treasurer.

The callup in Maui will involve about 250 men on this Island, about 50 on Molokai, and possible two or three on Lanai.
