Dependents won't get housing

Dependents of Hawaii National Guard 29th Brigade members will not be allowed to move into government quarters at Schofield Barracks, the Guard announced today.

The 3,300 men of the 29th, who will report at Schofield May 14, have been assigned to barracks on the post formerly occupied by members of the 25th Division. Officers will go to bachelor officers' quarters.

The work-week at first is

expected to be 48 hours or longer, a spokesman said.

The housing question for dependents awaits an ultimate assignment for the brigade and that may not come for a while.

The Guard also announced today that 135 members of the 29th Brigade who are attached to units in California will report to Schofield.

The guardsmen are the 40th Aviation Company. Also coming to Hawaii are 32 members of the 227th Military Intelligence Detachment from Arizona.

A spokesman said exemptions from the call-up include several high school students in Hawaii who will be allowed to graduate and enlisted men whose obligations expire on or before Dec. 12.
