College Students May Ask For Call-Up Delay

HONOLULU — (AP) — College students and instructors who are members of the 29th Infantry Brigade, Hawaii Army National Guard, scheduled for call-up May 13, may apply for

delay in reporting, according to the National Guard Bureau.

The authorization to grant delay in reporting covers college, vocational and trade school students, as well as instructors and teachers.

Seniors may have until the day after graduation to report to their units. All others will report the day following the end of the current school semester.

National Guard officials noted that requests for delay in reporting must be made by the individuals concerned through their assigned units and must be accompanied by a document or statement from the school regarding the individual's status in school.

Guardsmen May Renew Licenses Now

Police Sgt. Atsushi Sato, examiner of chauffeurs, today announced that the Relicensing Bureau will relicense all motorists affected in the call up of Hawaii National Guardsmen and Army Reservists.

The announcement came without any suspension of the alphabetical schedule of relicensing for the month of April.

Big Island drivers whose last names begin with the letters "K" to "L" are scheduled to renew their license this month, Sato said. In addition to motorists in this group, we will relicense all other Big Island motorists who are members of the Guard or Army Reserve slated for call up, he added.

The office hours of the License Bureau in Hilo are from 8 a.m. to 6 p.m., Monday through Friday.
