Checklist Issued For

National Guard headquarters on the Big Island today provided the following checklist of necessary documents for all members being called to active duty who have dependents:

- 1. Birth certificate of Guard member.
 - 2. Marriage certificate.
- 3. Birth certificate of each dependent.
- 4. Certified court adoption papers for all adopted chil-

dren 21 years of age or younger.

5. If previously married, divorce papers or death certificates terminating the previous marriage.

6. Statement from duly licensed physician or medical officer indicating that dependent children over 21 years of age mentally or physically incapacitated are incapable of self-support, and period of such incapacity.

7. Have information as to the exact name and location of any private school, college, or university where a dependent age 22 or younger is enrolled in a full-time course of study.

As many of these documents as are available should be brought to drill this Saturday and Sunday, Lt. Col. Fred Koehnen, commanding officer of the 2nd Battalion on the Big Island reported.

The remainder should be secured and turned in to unit armories as soon after as possible, he added. If extra photostatic copies are available, Guardsmen are asked to bring either the original or a copy and the Guard will reproduce them for use and return the individual's documents.

An individual without dependents will need his own birth certificate only, Koehnen said.

All members also were reminded to bring all clothing and equipment issued to this week-

end's drill for Showdown Inspection and-or serviceability turn-in or exchange.
