Brig. Gen. Takemoto to retire

Schaefer will head Guardsmen

Brig. Gen. Frederick A. Schaefer, III, commanding general of the Hawaii Army National Guard, has volunteered to head the Guard's 29th Infantry Brigade on active duty.

He was selected to succeed Brig. Gen. Francis S. Takemoto who will retire effective May 4.

Announcing the appointment, Maj. Gen. Benjamin J. Webster, adjutant general of Hawaii said, "Iam extremely pleased that General Schaefer has volunteered to take command of the 29th Infantry Brigade. General Schaefer is a highly qualified officer who should bring credit to the brigade in leading them during their period of active duty."

Before becoming commander of all Army Guard units in Hawaii in February, 1960, Gen. Schaefor commanded the 29th infantry Brigade. He assumed that post in January, 1959, receiving federal recognition as a brigadier general on April 21, 1959.

A fourth generation kamaaina, Gen. Schaefer was born in Honolulu on January 3, 1921. He attended Punahou School and Cornell University.

After graduation from Cornell in 1942, Schaefer was commissioned a second lieutenant in the infantry. He saw action at Guadalcanal with the 25th Infantry Division.

It was here in January, 1943, that he was wounded while leading his platoon in an assault on enemy

positions. For his actions, Schaefer was awarded the Distinguished service Cross, Bronze Star, Commendation Medal, Purple Heart and Combat Infantryman's Badge.

After returning to the mainland and recovering from his wounds, Schaefer was assigned to the 66th Division which was sent to Europe. He returned to the United States in the Fall of 1945.

Released from active service in 1945, Schaefer served as a major in the organized reserve corps until 1947. In May, 1947, he joined the Hawaii National Guard as intelli-

gence officer of the 298th Regimetal Combat Team. In 1948 he was assigned as executive officer of the

In 1948 he was assigned as executive officer of the 1st Battalion, 298th Infantry, and later that year became its commander.

In 1952, Schaefer served as executive officer of the regiment. The following year he assumed command of the 298th.

When the 298th Infantry

When the 298th Infantry was reorganized as an artillery anti-aircraft unit in 1957, he was appointed commander of the 298th AAA Group. He served in this post until his appointment as 29th Infantry Brigade commander in January, 1959.

In civilian life, Gen. Schaefer is vice president and a director of Ainamalu Corporation. Among his civilian activities, he is a member of the Chamber of Commerce and a vice president of the Downtown improvement. Association.

He is also a member of beothe executive committee and board of the Friends of the East-West Center

and former president and board member of the Gentral YMCA, as well as member of the executive committee of the Boy Scouts' Aloha Council.
